Monday: Tour historic Des Moines, visiting Iowa's Governor's Mansion, the Salisbury House, and Valley Junction, which boomed in the 1890s when the railroad moved its switching yards to west of Des Moines. Today its shopping remains as vibrant as ever. Lunch at the elegant Embassy Club while taking in panoramic views of the State Capitol.
