



Genealogists will gather in sunny Fort Lauderdale, Florida, for the National Genealogical Society 2016 Family History Conference, *Exploring the Centuries: Footprints in Time*. During the conference, being held 4–7 May 2016, participants may choose from 180 lectures and workshops. Lectures will cover a wide range of local, regional, and general genealogy topics which will help you build a solid foundation for your family history, fine-tune your research skills, and refine your methodology.

### PRE-REGISTRATION
