Select Faculty



DEAN ERWIN CHERMERINSKY is one of the nation's top experts in constitutional law, federal practice, civil rights and civil liberties, and appellate litigation. Chemerinsky is the founding Dean and Distinguished Professor of Law, and Raymond Pryke Professor of First Amendment Law, at the University of California, Irvine School of Law, with a joint appointment in Political Science. He is the author of seven books including casebook, *Constitutional Law*, which is one of the most widely read law textbooks in the country. Chemerinsky has also written nearly 200 law review articles in journals such as the *Harvard Law Review*, *Northwestern Law Review*, *Stanford Law Review* and *Yale Law Journal*. He frequently argues appellate cases, including matters before the U.S. Supreme Court and the U.S. Court of Appeal, and regularly serves as a commentator on legal issues for national and local media. He holds a J.D. from Harvard Law School and a B.S. from Northwestern University.

CLARE HUNTINGTON, JD is an expert in the fields of family law and poverty law. Her book, *Failure to Flourish: How Law Undermines Family Relationships* (Oxford 2014), won an Honorable Mention for the Professional and Scholarly Excellence (PROSE) Award in Law and Legal Studies from the Association of American Publishers. Professor Huntington has published widely in leading law journals, exploring the intersection of poverty and families and with a recent focus on non-marital families. Prior to joining the Fordham University faculty in 2011, Professor Huntington was an Associate Professor at the University of Colorado Law School. Professor Huntington earned her JD from Columbia Law School and her BA from Oberlin College.

JUDGE PATRICIA M. MARTIN is the Presiding Judge of the Child Protection Division of the Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois. Judge Martin received her appointment in January 2000 and since that time has worked to improve the Child Protection Division. She has introduced innovative new programs that have received media attention and that jurisdictions across the country have duplicated. During her tenure as Presiding Judge, the Child Protection Division's caseload has declined from over 27,000 cases to fewer than 7,000 cases, a reduction of over 56%. In addition to performing her administrative duties, Judge Martin continues to hear complex and high profile cases in the Child Protection Division. Judge Martin also served as President of the NCJFCJ from 2011-2012.



JAY OTTO, MS is a Research Scientist for the Center for Health and Safety Culture at in the Western Transportation Institute at Montana State University. Jay received a Bachelor's and Master's degree in engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He leads the research efforts for the Center as well as participates in research projects. He lives on a small farm in rural West Virginia with his wife, Lynette, two dogs, five horses and a cat.



CHIEF JUDGE RONALD J. WHITENER is Chief Judge of the Tulalip Tribal Court, a Justice on the Northwest Intertribal Court of Appeals, the Chehalis Tribal Court of Appeals and the Upper Skagit Tribal Court of Appeals. Judge Whitener is a member of the Squaxin Island Tribe, located in South Puget Sound, where he grew up and continues to participate in treaty fishing and as the Squaxin Island Commissioner of Business Affairs. He graduated from the University of Washington Law School in 1994 and returned to Squaxin as a tribal attorney representing the tribal government in treaty rights defense, tribal governance, tribal court development, gaming and other enterprises. He has been named to the Order of the Coif and Order of Barristers for his work in law and his experience as a courtroom advocate. In 2009, he was named the Association of American Law School's "Shanara Gilbert Emerging Clinician of the Year" and in 2011 he was named a "White House Champion of Change" by President Barack Obama for his advocacy for Native American clients.

RACHEL YEHUDA, PH.D. is a Professor of Psychiatry and Neuroscience at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai and Mental Health Patient Care Center Director at the Bronx Veterans Affairs. She has published several hundred scientific papers and compiled over 10 books examining diverse aspects of traumatic stress, and has studied PTSD and resilience in combat veterans, survivors of genocide, interpersonal violence and terrorism, as well as in animal models. Her work has focused on neuroendocrinology, neuroimaging, genomic and molecular biological studies of trauma, experimental therapeutics (pharmacological and psychotherapy trials), biomarkers, genetic and epigenetic heritability, gender differences, and suicide.

Professor Huntington's legal experience includes serving as an Attorney Advisor in the Justice Department's Office of Legal Counsel as well as clerking for Justice Harry A. Blackmun and Justice Stephen Breyer of the Supreme Court of the United States, Judge Merrick B. Garland of the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit, and Judge Denise Cote of the United States District Court of the Southern District of New York. Prior to joining the Fordham faculty in 2011, Professor Huntington was an Associate Professor at the University of Colorado Law School. Professor Huntington earned her JD from Columbia Law School and her BA from Oberlin College.

Professor Huntington will be presenting the Tuesday, July 19th morning plenary, *The Fundamental mismatch Between Family Law and Non-Marital Families*. This presentation will focus on the seismic shift of American family, with marriage rates plummeting and more than four in ten children now born to unmarried parents. Children of unmarried parents fall far behind children of married parents on a variety of metrics, contributing to stark inequality among children. Professor Huntington contends that family law is part of the problem and that it is essential to adopt a new approach, better suited to the needs of non-marital families.

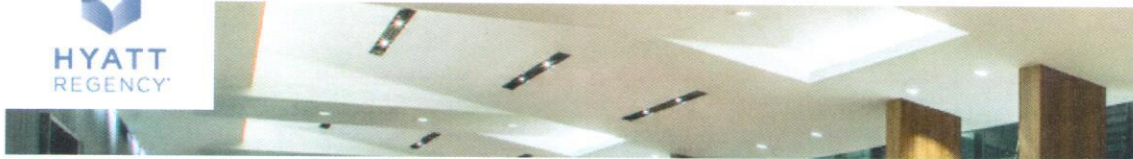

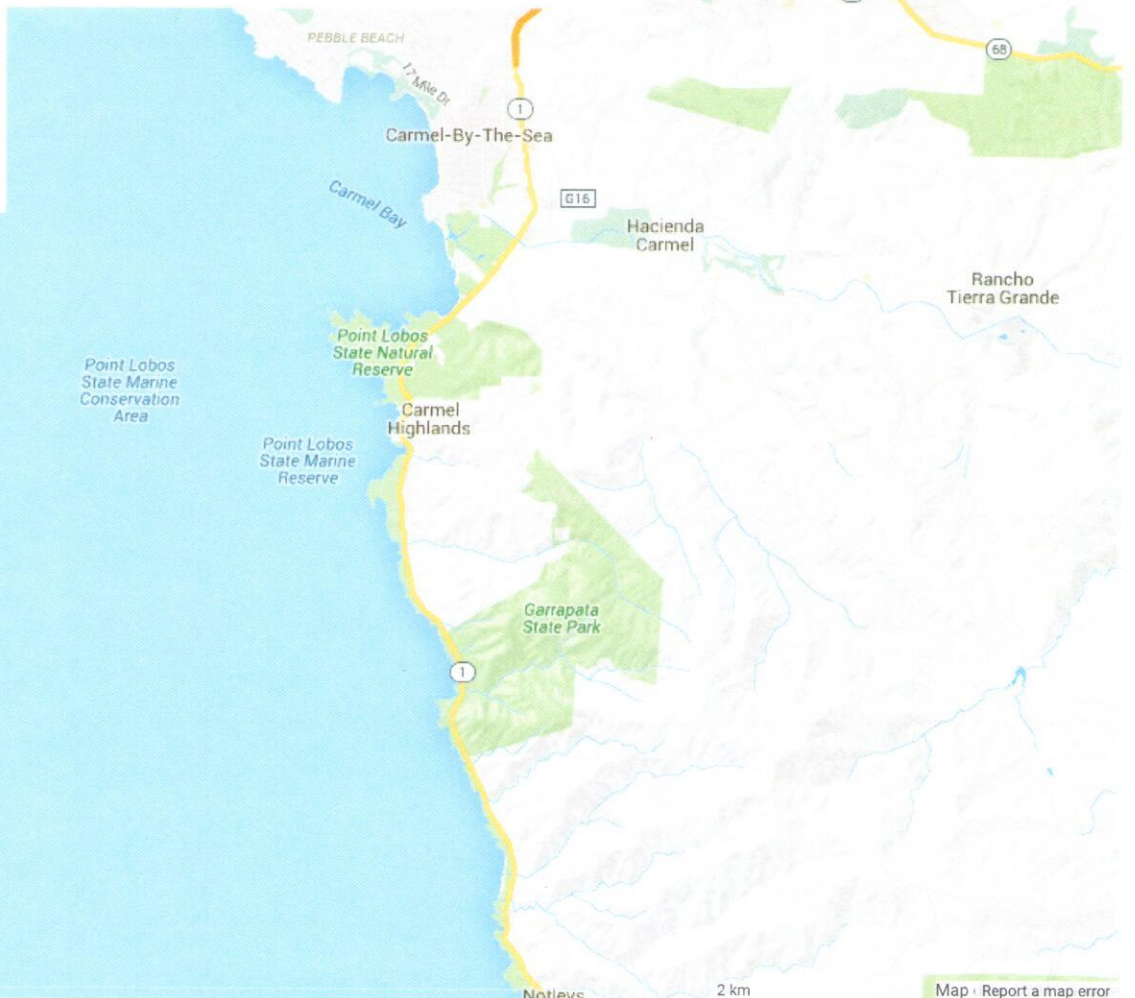
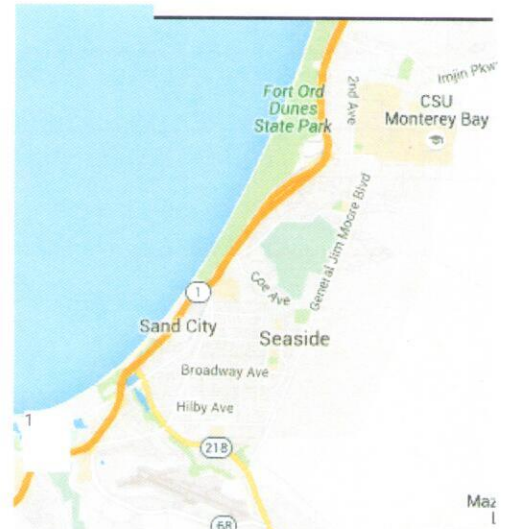
