#### Comparative Analysis for 2016

The Fort Bend County Precinct One Constable Office patrols and delivers court related documents inside of Precinct One Fort Bend County. Approximately fourteen deputies are assigned to perform these duties. Two neighborhoods inside of Precinct One have contracted with the Precinct One Constable's Office for supplemental patrol and traffic enforcement. Six full-time deputies were assigned to patrol the neighborhoods within Precinct One.

Five deputies were assigned to patrol the first neighborhood known as MUD 23 and 24, located in the Fresno area of Fort Bend County for only eight days in 2016. This is the most active area in regards to call volume and traffic enforcement.

As of the census of 2010, there were 19,069 people living in the Fresno area. The racial composition of Fresno, Texas was White: 18.7% (Non-Hispanic Whites: 5.3%), Hispanic or Latino (of any race): 33.1%, Asian: 1.0%, Black or African American: 59.7%, Two or more races: 2.9%, American Indian and Alaska Native: 0.6%.

One deputy was assigned to the second neighborhood known as MUD 162 (Sunrise Meadows Subdivision), located in the Richmond area of Fort Bend County for five months and seven days in 2016.

As of the census of 2010, there were 11, 679 people living in the city of Richmond. The racial composition of Richmond, Texas was White: 60.6% (Non-Hispanic Whites: 25.3%), Hispanic or Latino: 55.4%, Asian: 1.0%, Black or African American: 18.0%, Two or more races: 2.5%, and American Indian and Alaska Native: 0.9%.

As a whole, the 2010 census shows the population of Fort Bend County was 585,375. The racial composition of Fort Bend County, Texas was White: 50.6% (Non-Hispanic Whites: 36.2%), Black or African American: 21.5%, American Indian and Alaska Native: 0.4%, Asian: 17.0 %, Native Hawaiian Other Pacific Islander: 0.1%, Two or More Races: 2.9%, and Hispanic or Latino: 23.7%.

There were no complaints of Racial Profiling reported in 2016.

#### Certification to Report 2.132 (Tier 2)

#### Policy Requirements (2.132(b) CCP):

Each law enforcement agency in this state shall adopt a detailed written policy on racial profiling. The policy must:

- (1) clearly define acts constituting racial profiling;
- (2) strictly prohibit peace officers employed by the agency from engaging in racial profiling;
- (3) implement a process by which an individual may file a complaint with the agency if the individual believes that a peace officer employed by the agency has engaged in racial profiling with respect to the individual;
- (4) provide public education relating to the agency's complaint process;
- (5) require appropriate corrective action to be taken against a peace officer employed by the agency who, after an investigation, is shown to have engaged in racial profiling in violation of the agency's policy adopted under this article;
- (6) require collection of information relating to motor vehicle stops in which a citation is issued and to arrests made as a result of those stops, including information relating to:
  - (A) the race or ethnicity of the individual detained;
  - (B) whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the individual detained consented to the search; and
  - (C) whether the peace officer knew the race or ethnicity of the individual detained before detaining that individual; and
- (7) require the chief administrator of the agency, regardless of whether the administrator is elected, employed, or appointed, to submit an annual report of the information collected under Subdivision (6) to:
  - (A) the Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education; and
  - (B) the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency, if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state.


