Fort Bend County Social Services has been in existence for 65 years. Initially it was created by County Commissioners Court to fulfill the mandate of Article 2351 of Vernon's Annotated Civil Statutes, which directs County government to provide support for impoverished individuals. In the 1950's, the department became known as the County Welfare Office, and its objective was to improve the coordination of poverty alleviating efforts throughout its immediate and surrounding areas. Eventually, the department adopted the title of Fort Bend County Social Services and it became one of the leading providers of needed resources for its vulnerable residents. Currently the department provides utility, rent/mortgage, emergency shelter, food, medication, assistance for indigent burial services, transitional supportive housing, case management, unmet emergency needs and Benefits Bank to the residents of Fort Bend County. The mission of FBCSS is to provide an array of social services to meet the needs of individuals and families in Fort Bend County and enhance their quality of life. Our vision is to guide individuals and families to transition from crisis to sustainability. In the spring of 2015 Fort Bend County Collaboration Information System was established by five local non-profit organizations and two county departments. The Mission of the collaborative is to implement a collaborative data collection and sharing system that will coordinate client information, to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of service delivery over time. In 2016 FBCSS was awarded the Texas Veterans Commission (TVC) grant to provide services to Veterans and surviving spouses of Veterans. Services include rent, mortgage, emergency shelter, child care expenses, deposits and assistance for many other unmet needs that keep the Veteran and/or family members from achieving self-sustainability. The VOCA grant was awarded in late 2016 in order to provide case management services to Victims of Crime.

Fort Bend County Collaboration Information System (FBCCIS) was established by five local non-profit organizations and two county departments. The Collaborative set forward to formalize and enhance existing referral networks that currently includes, but is not limited to, non-profit organizations that provide basic human needs services throughout Fort Bend County. Collectively FBCCIS partners will share client data utilizing a software system entitled "Caseworthy." The computerized data collection platform captures client level information on the characteristics of individuals and families and their needs, including basic human services and other social or medical needs. This coordination will eliminate confusion for families seeking services, avoid duplication of services, and provide a streamlined process for individuals, churches, businesses and others wishing to donate supplies, volunteer efforts, and assist the county's most vulnerable populations. The coordinated network of specialized service providers will facilitate the delivery of services in an efficient and effective manner. The main focus of this collaboration system is to work together to target the most vulnerable individuals, eliminating the need for clients to search for resources on their own. In essence, it is to create a "one door" policy. If a client needing services reaches out to one of the collaboration partners, that partner can reach out directly to other partners as part of a collaborative system.

This integrated system ensures that vulnerable individuals' who seek assistance, are provided the services they need in a timely manner, eliminating personal travel time, possible transportation costs, and eliminating the frustration that often arises when clients feel overwhelmed in navigating the care that they need. This collaborative system will also allow clients to feel an additional sense of security, knowing that multiple members of service agencies in their community are coming together to help meet their needs. If

clients are not able to obtain specific financial assistance, shelter or other resources from the first agency they visit, they will feel more confident knowing that the agencies that can assist them will not only be referred to them, but also in direct communication (as members of this system) with the first Case Manager or Coordinator that they speak with. Guidance and direct communication with agencies that have more resources for the target groups that are victims of domestic violence and crime, can also be quickly given to serve vulnerable at-risk individuals in need in a timely manner. Administering a quick response, which may be critical to the health and social well-being of county residents who need financial recovery assistance, temporary/long term housing solutions, rehabilitation therapy, access to affordable medical care and many other resources, is an effective solution that better guarantees the delivery of these provision of services.

May - August 2017: Plan and implement the 3rd Annual "Back to School Bash".

October 2017-December 2017 - Plan and implement 4th Annual "Santa Claus is Coming to Fort Bend County".
