Briefly describe the amendments being requested.

Fort Bend County, TX is the recipient of a grant from the Continuum of Care competition – TX0353L6E001503. The grant was recently renewed for FY 2016 (TX0353L6E001604).

Fort Bend County is requesting that the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development transfer grant TX0353L6E001604 to the Fort Bend County Women's Center. In 2007 when the County first applied for this grant, it was under the Shelter Plus Care Program. The Shelter Plus Care Program required the grant recipient to be a State, unit of local government or public housing authority and could not be a non-profit organization. Although the Fort Bend County Women's Center has always assisted the County in administering this program, because it was a non-profit organization it could not be the grant recipient.

In FY 2013 the Shelter Plus Care grant became a part of the Continuum of Care grant and all Shelter Plus Care program requirements were removed. Therefore, the Fort Bend County Women's Center can now be a direct recipient of the grant. Fort Bend County has discussed this request with the Fort Bend County Women's Center and they are willing to be the grant recipient. The grant is currently under contract to provide 20 units of tenant-based rental assistance to individuals/families who are fleeing or attempting to flee domestic violence who have a chronic mental health condition.

As the recipient of the CoC S+C grant the Fort Bend County Women's Center will utilize the same number of units (20) and provide the same level of service as is currently being provided. The Fort Bend County Women's Center will not request any additional supportive service funds in the budget.

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
