It serves as the central all source, shared knowledge bank on human trafficking activity, human traffickers and their networks, and the central dissemination and coordination point for law enforcement, select nonprofits and the professionals working to end modern day slavery. Our iHTAC corporate partners are Marinus Analytics, Shadow Dragon Cyber Intelligence, Atlantic Data Forensics, RedJack, TRAC, Verisk Analytics, and A21.

As a nonprofit, private intelligence organization, DeliverFund becomes sensitized to the needs of LE agencies fighting human trafficking and assists them in resourcing the technology and associated training needed to fight modern day slavery.

The DeliverFund CHTIOC is a 10-day course taught and led by some of the best cyber intelligence and intelligence operations instructors in the country. We additionally include subject matter experts who understand interviewing and assisting victims. Instructors include DeliverFund, ShadowDragon Cyber Intelligence, Marinus Analytics, TRAC, A21(restoration services). This counter human trafficking intelligence operations course was designed to meet the needs of and assist Law Enforcement agencies in effectively resourcing their agents in a manner congruous with modern day technology. Course training will consist of OSINT and HUMINT collection as well as tactical techniques ending with an operations exercise for you to practice the execution of what you have learned.

The course will train law enforcement in using the best counter human trafficking technology suite and send you home with it. The targets you develop during your cyber exercises will be operationally ready for you to execute upon your return home.

The course is free to Law Enforcement Officers and we are confident you will return home with more effective tools and skills to fight human trafficking in your AOR.

Emily routinely works alongside advising and teaching stakeholders at various levels on micro and macro approaches to combating and measuring human trafficking in the US and abroad.

enforcement units. Greg is one of the most sought out hand to hand combat trainers in the world, and he has now made his methodologies available to members of Alpha Brigade. Greg's expertise is second to none, and his unique experiences in the sport, civilian and tactical worlds combine to help you gain the advantage. Alpha Brigade's instructors are hand-picked by Greg Jackson, and the programs are taught exclusively by former CIA operatives and Military Special Operations personnel. 7. A21: Victim Interviews and Restoration Instruction

A21 is a global nonprofit organization whose strategy is to reach, rescue and restore lives affected by human trafficking. The organization works closely with law enforcement to assist victims of human trafficking by providing legal assistance, aftercare through housing, medical treatment, counseling, education, employment and repatriation based on their individual needs.
