Introduction

The Internet Crimes Against Children Fund supports law enforcement agencies with responding to online enticement of children by sexual predators, child exploitation, child obscenity, and pornography cases.

Project Abstract :

The Fort Bend County District Attorney's Office currently has one investigator assigned to the Houston Metro ICAC Task Force. This Investigator's tasks & duties have been successfully carried out, however his assignments are now backlogged. An additional Investigator is needed in order to meet the needs of the Office, the Task Force & Fort Bend County as a whole. The additional investigator would accomplish these tasks: - Distribute work load with Preventative and Reactive Case Investigations - Assist and network with Fort Bend County Law Enforcement agencies in order to provide investigative support to ICAC investigations as well as to Prosecutors in the Office with Child Exploitation Cases, and provide community education regarding Internet safety for children and parents, through local organizations.

Problem Statement :

The Fort Bend County District Attorney's Office (FBCDAO) currently has one position that is federally grant funded through the Houston Metro ICAC Task Force (HM-ICAC). Currently, that investigator is managing a workload that includes CyberTip/NCMEC referral investigations, Peer2Peer/DarkWeb/Freenet and other file-sharing network child pornography investigations, (which are extremely time-consuming investigations), as well as Undercover Chat investigations. He assists local law enforcement agencies with their ICAC related investigations and search warrants and performs Digital Forensics Services (conducting forensic analyses on mobile devices and computers). In addition, he conducts regional training for Taskforce ICAC investigators and provides certification training throughout the state. This investigative position also requires constant training to maintain competence in an ever-changing technical field. Time spent obtaining required training to maintain competence leaves this office without the technical support necessary to handle incoming time-sensitive ICAC investigations and without support for the prosecutions of computer-facilitated evidence offenses. The services this overloaded investigator performs are so valuable that it is irresponsible not to supplement his role with an additional investigator to perform the same functions.

Supporting Data :

The law enforcement initiatives involving online Undercover Chat (UC) operations are highly successful when conducted and cause a substantial increase in the number of predators identified and cases filed. For example, in previous years, one Fort Bend County (FBC) law enforcement agency had a dedicated staff of three ICAC investigators. Seven UC chat operations were conducted in Fort Bend County from November 2014 to November 2015 and netted 60 arrests that resulted in approximately 60 Online Solicitation of a Minor charges being filed. By contrast, only one Online Solicitation of a Minor case was filed in 2013, when no UC operations occurred in Fort Bend County. In 2018, HM-ICAC agencies participated in a collaborative initiative in which during a three month time period multiple UC operations were conducted by various participating agencies. Approximately 60 arrests resulted. In 2019, in a two month time frame, again, with multiple UC operations conducted by various participating agencies, approximately 50 arrests resulted. See also the number of active investigations and targets indicated below in "Project Approach & Activities" that the single Fort Bend County District Attorney's Office HM-ICAC investigator is currently reporting.

Project Approach & Activities:

The project investigator will be trained to do the exact same investigative work as the existing HM- ICAC investigator working at the Fort Bend County District Attorney's Office; however, the individual will concentrate solely on investigation initiatives and will not perform the same Digital Forensic Services function as the current FBCDAO HM-ICAC investigator. The new position will receive required training and then assume the same investigative workload, same command structure, and will utilize the same investigative methodology as the current ICAC investigator. The one HM-ICAC Task Force Investigator currently assigned to the Fort Bend County DA's Office has the following caseload as of June 28, 2019, broken down by investigative efforts and computer forensic analysis support: 1. Cyber-Tip/National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) referral investigations (51 Active Investigations) 2. Peer 2 Peer (55 targets in FBC in past year, only 2 actively investigated) 3. DarkWeb (6 targets in FBC in the last 240 days, only 2 actively investigated) 4. Undercover Chat (UC) Investigations (Currently Non Existent in FBC with numerous targets being investigated by agencies surrounding FBC). The current investigator has become a certified computer forensic examiner and has set up a digital forensics lab. Since November 2018, the current HM-ICAC investigator for FBCDAO has provided Forensic Analysis support for multiple investigations in numerous Fort Bend County law enforcement agencies, as well as some Harris County and Waller County agencies. His forensic analysis responsibilities are very time consuming and account for approximately 85% of the investigator's time. He has conducted Mobile Device examinations for sixteen ICAC cases, six Human Trafficking cases, three Child Sexual Abuse cases, and a Sexual Assault case. He has provided Computer Forensic Analysis for six ICAC and/or Child Sexual Abuse cases.

Capacity & Capabilities:

The current HM-ICAC investigator assigned to the Fort Bend County DA's Office has been highly successful, to the point of being overloaded by assignments. This grant request/application for an additional ICAC Investigator will increase the investigative capacity assignments using the same proven investigative methods and techniques, within a currently successful structure.

Performance Management :

The goal of the grant is to into decrease the investigative backlog and increase the investigative capacity of the work being done by the HM ICAC Investigator already assigned to the Fort Bend County DA's Office. The same methods used for tracking the investigative progress of the existing HM-ICAC Investigator will be used for this additional person.

Target Group :

Victims of Internet related crimes against children and victims of technology facilitated child sexual exploitation.

Evidence-Based Practices:

Undercover Chat (UC) investigative operations, which have proven to be a highly successful preventative measure in identifying and holding accountable perpetrators who seek to sexually exploit children via use of the Internet through computers, mobile phones, and other devices, will be utilized by this investigator. Likewise, proven ICAC investigative methods and protocols regarding Cyber-Tip/NCMEC referrals, as well as child pornography and child sexual exploitation offenses that utilize Peer2Peer, Dark Web, Freenet and other file sharing networks will be utilized to hold more offenders accountable while increasing victim safety.
