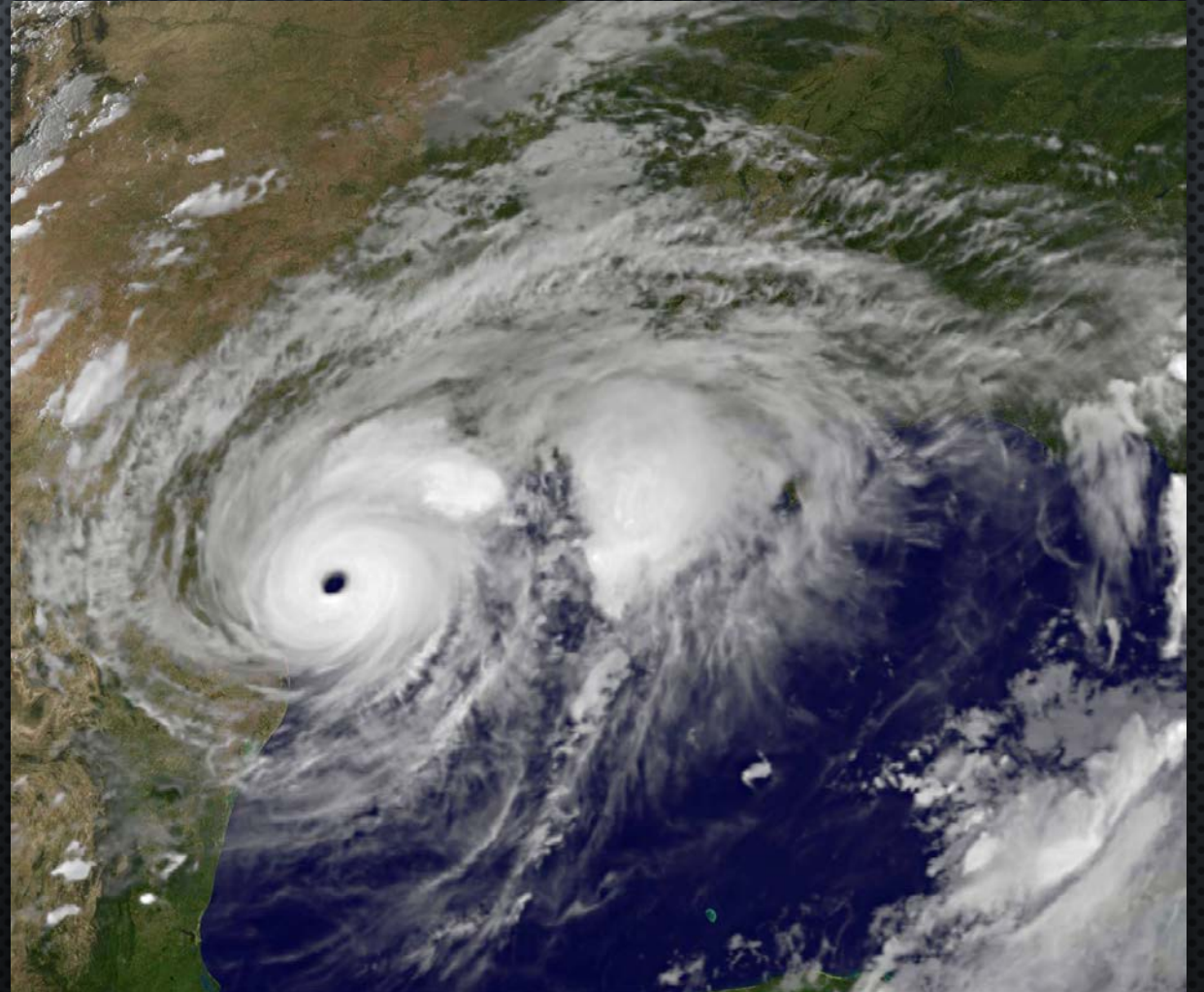

- ASSESS PROJECTS THAT MITIGATE FUTURE DISASTERS.



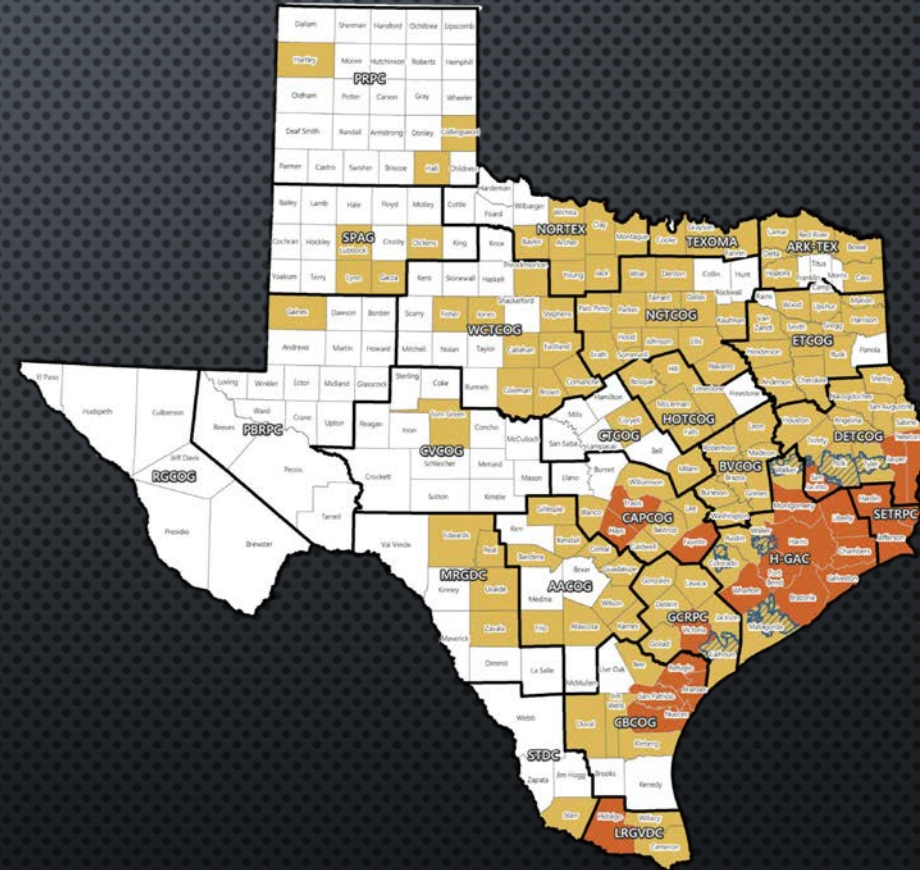
3. AMOUNT OF CDBG-MIT FUNDS AVAILABLE

- HUD ALLOCATED TEXAS \$4.29 BILLION THROUGH THEIR NOTICE PUBLISHED 84 FR 45838 (AUGUST 30, 2019).
- FORT BEND COUNTY IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE 2015 FLOODS, 2016 FLOODS, AND HURRICANE HARVEY STATE COMPETITIONS.
- OVER \$1.2BILLION IS AVAILABLE FOR THE STATE COMPLETIONS DUE ON 10/28/2020.

3. AMOUNT OF CDBG-MIT FUNDS AVAILABLE (COTND)

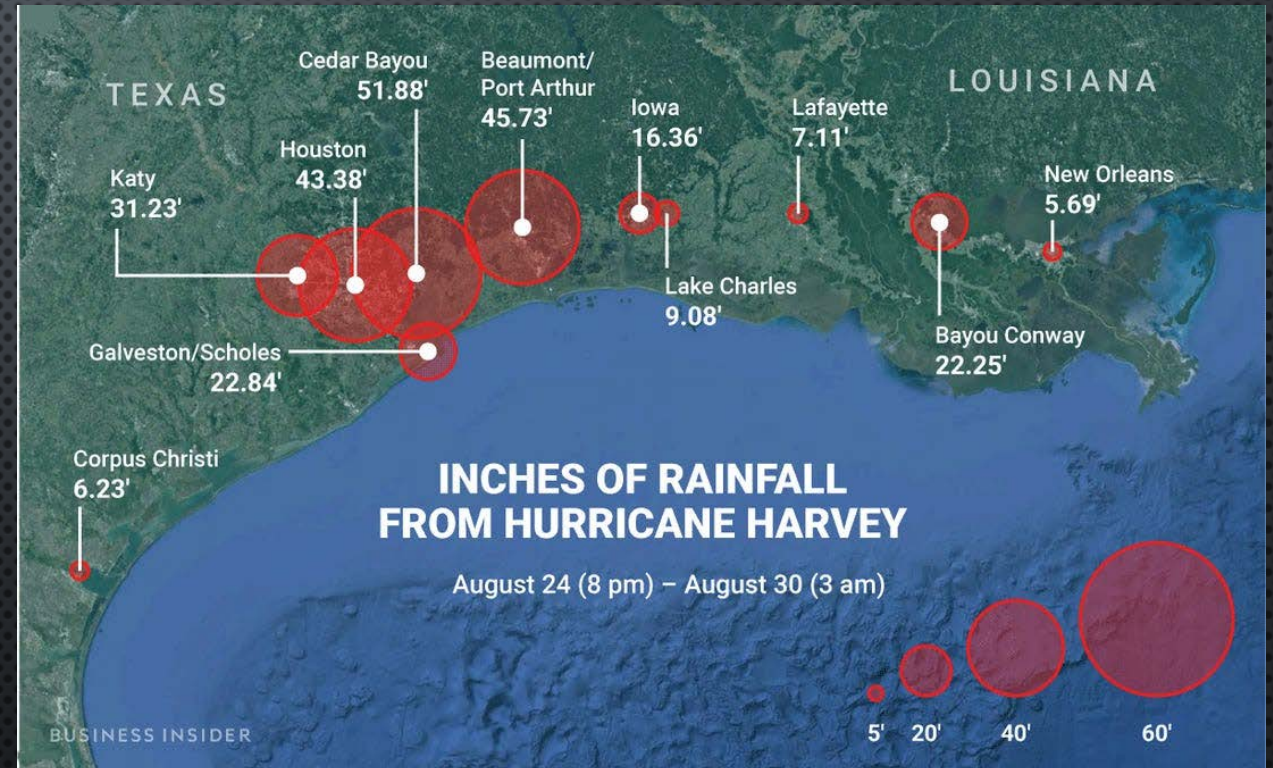
- FORT BEND COUNTY IS LISTED AS HUD MOST IMPACTED & DISTRESSED IN 2016 FLOOD AND HURRICANE HARVEY COMPETITIONS. THE COUNTY IS LISTED AS STATE MOST IMPACTED & DISTRESSED IN THE 2015 FLOOD COMPETITION.
- “AT LEAST” 50% OF FUNDS NEED TO BE SPENT IN HUD MOST IMPACTED & DISTRESSED REGIONS.
- “UP TO” 50% OF FUNDS NEED TO BE SPENT IN STATE MOST IMPACTED & DISTRESSED REGIONS.



4. EXPLANATION OF ELIGIBLE CDBG-MIT ACTIVITIES

“THOSE ACTIVITIES THAT INCREASE RESILIENCE TO DISASTER AND REDUCE OR ELIMINATE THE LONG-TERM RISK OF LOSS OF LIFE, INJURY, DAMAGE TO AND LOSS OF PROPERTY, AND SUFFERING AND HARDSHIP, BY LESSENING THE IMPACT OF FUTURE DISASTERS.”

“A PROJECT IS A COMBINATION OF ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES WORKING TOGETHER TO REDUCE THE RISKS OF IDENTIFIED NATURAL HAZARDS FOR A DEFINED GEOGRAPHIC AREA AND POPULATION. ALL PROPOSED ACTIVITIES MUST SUPPORT THE OVERALL MITIGATION PROJECT AND THE OVERALL PROJECT WILL MEET ON ONE CDBG-MIT NATIONAL OBJECTIVE”



5. THE USE OF PAST DISASTER RECOVERY FUNDS

- FORT BEND COUNTY HAS COMPLETED A VARIETY OF DISASTER RECOVERY PROJECTS DATING BACK TO HURRICANE IKE.
- OVER \$40 MILLION IN CDBG-DR FUNDING.



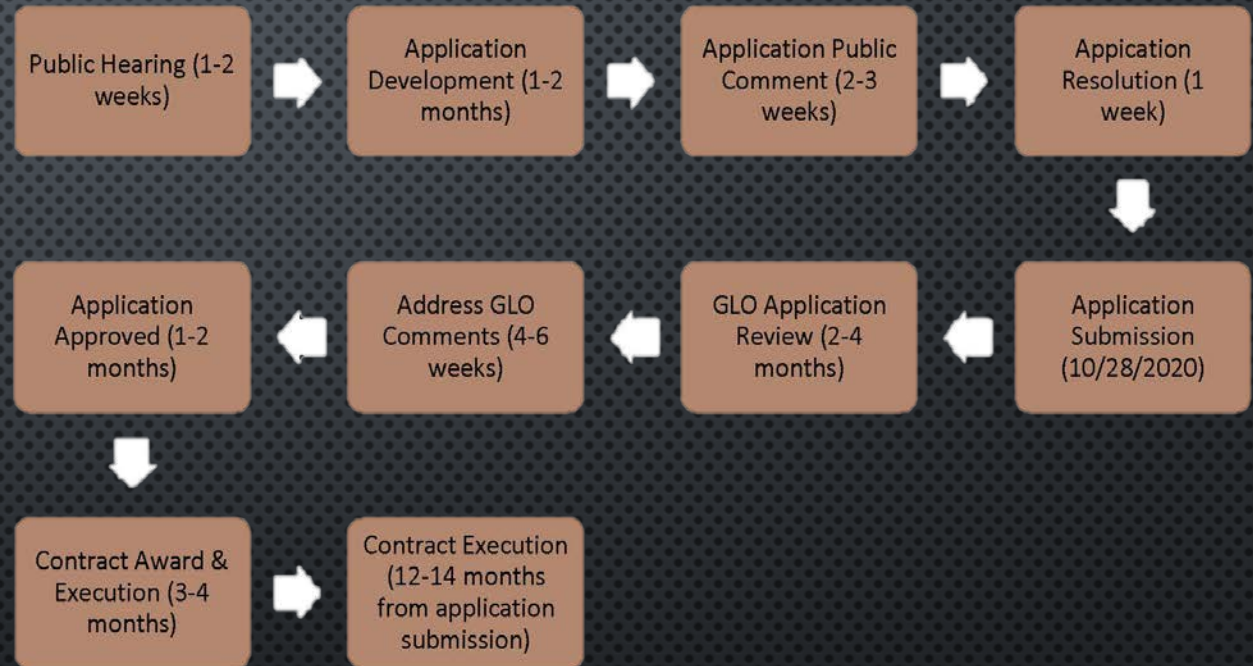
7. MINIMIZING DISPLACEMENT OF PERSONS BY PROJECT ACTIVITIES

- PRIMARY OBJECTIVE WILL BE TO LIMIT THE DISPLACEMENT OF INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES.
- PROJECT DEVELOPMENT SHOULD CONSIDER A VARIETY OF ALTERNATIVES TO ENSURE PROTECTION OF LIFE AND PROPERTY.



8. DISCUSSION OF THE APPLICATION PROCESS

- APPLICATIONS ARE DUE ON OCTOBER 28, 2020.
- PUBLIC HEARING IS PHASE I OF CITIZEN PARTICIPATION.
- ONCE AN APPLICATION IS DEVELOPED IT WILL BE POSTED FOR PUBLIC COMMENT (MINIMUM OF 14-DAY COMMENT PERIOD).
- CITY COUNCIL WILL OFFICIALLY AUTHORIZE APPLICATION FOR SUBMISSION.
