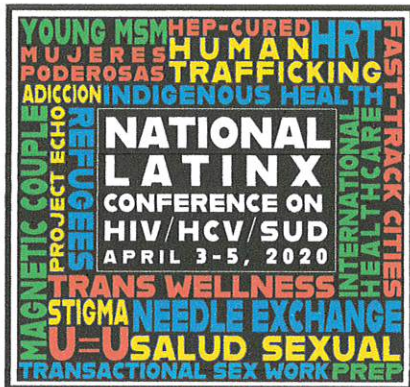


National Latinx Conference on HIV/HCV/SUD
