Per target weekend: 2-3 prosecutors, 2 nurses/phlebotomists, 1 magistrate/judge, 1 administrative staff, multiple law enforcement officers.

Administering the grant program requires a centralized location for prosecutors to meet with officers to produce search warrants for blood, to be signed by a magistrate, and then draw blood by qualified medical personnel. The FBC Sheriff's Office has been used in the past. IT needs are met. Supplies largely consist of medical supplies for blood draws.
