PREVIOUS AREAS OF INTEREST – TRACK, MONITOR & SUPPORT/OPPOSE

- 1. Support bills that Promote Local Control
- 2. Monitor Election bills
- 2. Support Animal Protection bills see Our Legislative Priorities Texas Humane Network (thln.org); animal cruelty offender database; criminal responsibility for certain vicious dog attacks
- 3. Support Medicaid Expansion bills
- 4. Oppose Unfunded Mandate bills/provisions
- 5. Oppose Revenue Caps
- 6. Support the Continuation of HB3 funding for Schools
- **Note that as of 12-12-22, 1275 bills have been filed, and there are usually around 7000 bills filed during a session; thus, it isn't possible at this time to give you a full landscape of bills for your consideration, but we can give you weekly updates of bills filed.
- **Note that House & Senate interim reports have not yet been released, which can/do shed light on where the different chambers are headed on all policy fronts.

FUNDING ISSUES

- SUPPORT FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE FOLLOWING:
- 1. Mental health
- 2. Criminal/Juvenile Justice -- Juvenile Services, Pre-trial Programs, CSCDs
- 3. Transportation/Infrastructure

**Note that the budget bills have not yet been filed.

MISCELLANEOUS CONCEPTS FOR CONSIDERATION

- 1. Reduce red tape for County Atty's office for Civil Commitments.
- 2. Allow Dist. Clerk to accept checks and money orders for passport offices.
- 3. Allow Dist. Clerk to recoup its expense for sending certified notices to persons having an interest in excess proceeds from the sale of delinquent property.

COMMISSIONER ANDY MEYERS'S PROPOSALS

- 1. Increase transparency and accountability of special purpose districts.
- 2. Place emphasis on next generation energy, such as nuclear energy.
- 3. Increase funding for broadband and mobility.
