### FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES

This First Amendment to Agreement for Professional Engineering Services ("First Amendment") is made and entered into by and between Fort Bend County, Texas ("County"), a political subdivision of the state of Texas, and SES Horizon Consulting Engineers, Inc. ("CONSULTANT"). County and CONSULTANT may be referred to individually as a "Party" or collectively as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, the Parties previously entered into that certain Agreement for Professional Engineering Services on July 26, 2022 (the "Agreement") for the Fort Bend County Mobility Bond Project No. 20208 pursuant to SOQ 14-025; and

WHEREAS, by execution of this First Amendment, the Parties desire to amend the Agreement to provide for additional Services, to increase the total Maximum Compensation for the completion of such services, and to otherwise ratify and confirm all the terms and conditions as set forth therein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the Parties do mutually agree that the Agreement between the Parties is hereby amended as follows:

- 1. **Scope of Services**. County shall pay CONSULTANT an additional Three Hundred Forty Three Thousand Three Hundred Fifteen and 87/100 Dollars (\$343,315.87) for the performance and completion of additional services as described in CONSULTANT's Proposal dated February 22, 2024 (the "Services") attached hereto as "Exhibit A-1" and incorporated by reference for all intents and purposes.
- 2. Limit of Appropriation. CONSULTANT understands and agrees that the Maximum Compensation payable to CONSULTANT for Services rendered under this Agreement is hereby increased to an amount not to exceed Seven Hundred Forty Six Thousand One Hundred Sixty Four and 22/100 (\$746,164.22) authorized as follows:

\$402,848.35 under the Agreement \$343,315.87 under this First Amendment

In no event shall the amount paid by County under this Agreement exceed the Maximum Compensation without a County approved change order. CONSULTANT clearly understands and agrees, such understanding and agreement being of the absolute essence of this Agreement, that County shall have available the total maximum sum of Seven Hundred Forty Six Thousand One Hundred Sixty Four and 22/100 (\$746,164.22)

specifically allocated to fully discharge any and all liabilities County may incur under the Agreement.

CONSULTANT does further understand and agree, said understanding and agreement also being of the absolute essence of the Agreement, that the total Maximum Compensation that CONSULTANT may become entitled to and the total maximum sum that County may become liable to pay to CONSULTANT under the Agreement shall not under any conditions, circumstances, or interpretations thereof exceed Seven Hundred Forty Six Thousand One Hundred Sixty Four and 22/100 (\$746,164.22).

- 3. **Certain State Law Requirements for Contracts.** The contents of this Section are required by Texas law and are included by County regardless of content For purposes of Sections 2252.152, 2271.002, and 2274.002, Texas Government Code, as amended, CONSULTANT hereby verifies that CONSULTANT and any parent company, wholly owned subsidiary, majority-owned subsidiary, and affiliate:
  - A. Unless affirmatively declared by the United States government to be excluded from its federal sanctions regime relating to Sudan or Iran or any federal sanctions regime relating to a foreign terrorist organization, is not identified on a list prepared and maintained by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts under Section 806.051, 807.051, or 2252.153 of the Texas Government Code.
  - B. If employing ten (10) or more full-time employees and this Agreement has a value of \$100,000.00 or more, CONSULTANT does not boycott Israel and is authorized to agree in such contracts not to boycott Israel during the term of such contracts. "Boycott Israel" has the meaning provided in § 808.001 of the Texas Government Code.
  - C. If employing ten (10) or more full-time employees and this Agreement has a value of \$100,000.00 or more, CONSULTANT does not boycott energy companies and is authorized to agree in such contracts not to boycott energy companies during the term of such contracts. "Boycott energy company" has the meaning provided in § 809.001 of the Texas Government Code.
  - D. If employing ten (10) or more full-time employees and this Agreement has a value of \$100,000.00 or more, CONSULTANT does not have a practice, policy, guidance, or directive that discriminates against a firearm entity or firearm trade association and is authorized to agree in such contracts not to discriminate against a firearm entity or firearm trade association during the term of such contracts. "Discriminate against a firearm entity or firearm trade association" has the meaning provided in § 2274.001(3) of the Texas Government Code. "Firearm entity" and "firearm trade association" have the meanings provided in § 2274.001(6) and (7) of the Texas Government Code.

- 4. **Recitals.** The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein by reference and made a part of the Agreement.
- 5. **Human Trafficking.** BY ACCEPTANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT, CONSULTANT ACKNOWLEDGES THAT FORT BEND COUNTY IS OPPOSED TO HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND THAT NO COUNTY FUNDS WILL BE USED IN SUPPORT OF SERVICES OR ACTIVITIES THAT VIOLATE HUMAN TRAFFICKING LAWS.
- 6. **Modifications and Conflict.** Except as modified herein, the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect and has not been otherwise modified or amended. If there is a conflict among documents that make up the Agreement, this First Amendment shall prevail with regard to the conflict.

SES Horizon Consulting Engineers, Inc. (SES) respectfully submits this supplemental fee proposal request for the above referenced project to include the professional engineering and technical services related to the current scope of work for the subject project versus the original scope of work. SES previously provided a level of effort (LOE) and request for authorization for this project based on the original scope on March 16, 2022. To date SES has submitted the Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) and 70% Final Design Plans for the subject project. SES has included an LOE and subprovider proposals for your reference and use.

Construction Cost To Date: \$9,972,260.00 (Includes A 20.00% Contingency)

(\$8,310,217.00 X 1.20)

Original Construction Cost: \$2,203,950.00

### Project Scope Changes To Date

- A. Current Project has evolved from a simple existing asphalt widening project with open ditches drainaing to Oyster Creek without a closed system to a concrete curb and gutter pavement structure with both open and closed drainage systems that outfall to Oyster Creek. Retaining walls with rail barriers are required for this project. The existing structure under TFR is a large CMP Arch Pipe that requires extentsions on both sides. SES developed several iteration (3-4) designs to get to the proposed plan layout to date.
- B. The original intent was for SES Horizon Consulting Engineers, Inc. (SES) was to simply tie-in to a design by "others" West and East of Sienna Parkway. SES provided many iteration designs with "others", SES eventually ended up providing the proposed intersection design line work that SES would tie-in to

and be incorporated by "others".

- C. The proposed drainage system to date will require open ditches, closed storm sewers and inlets to capture road drainage. The original scope did not include these components.
- D. The TCP will be much more complex and include detours to construct the original scope versus the current scope.
- E. SES developed several iterations of proposed typical sections and plan view development in an effort to reduce and minimize right of way takings. To date, SES has eliminated the need for additional right of way from ~20-25 parcels to 0 parcels.
- F. The 30% plan set development as a component of the PER and PER meeting will require significant and major changes. The plan and profile sheets are much more complex then the original scope. Plan and profile sheets will be required for the proposed retaining walls.
- G. Additional Services SES recommends for final design: stake and monument the existing right of way at every existing parcel, tree prerevation and protection plan and TDLR review and approval for proposed sidewalks.
- H. The fee structure for this project should be based on the current construction cost which is ~452% greater than the original scope by using standard the FBC design fee calculator.

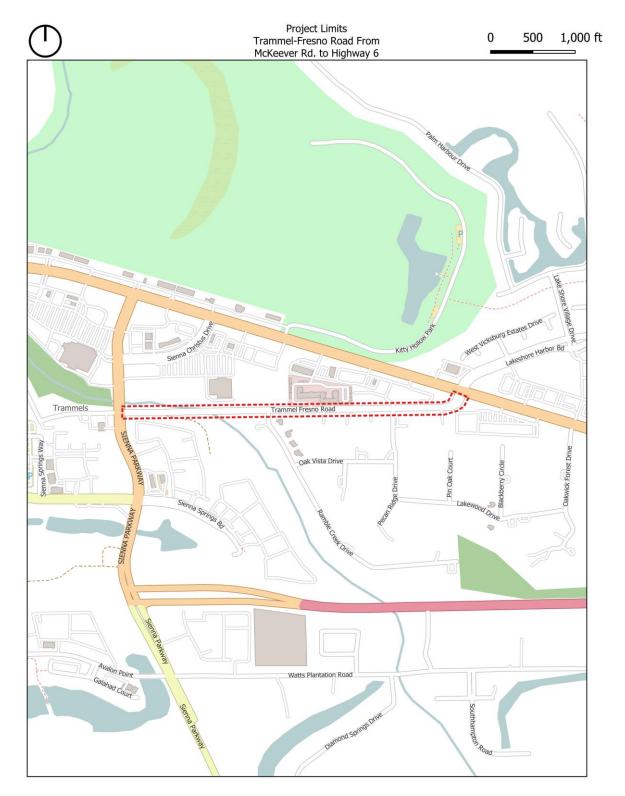

### B. Tree Protection and Mitigation Plan Development (Redlines)

- Design Review Review of construction documents to determine any areas of conflict between the design and tree preservation. Review will include the following potential impacts:

  - ii. New construction locations
  - iii. Open pit or trench locations
