

Bates Allen Park is a Fort Bend County Park located in the town of Kendleton, Texas with a total acreage of 236 acres. Within the park, four acres have been designated for a Memorial park that will include two Historical Cemeteries and two Museums. The existing cemeteries and other monuments will create a celebratory space for life through an exploration of history. Planned programing is to include new connective trails rom the new memorial park to the historic sites of Newman Chapel and Oak Hill Cemeteries. There will be planned spaces for future art and other monuments. Additionally, there will be a separate black cowboy museum housing artifacts and historical archives related to the black cowboy experience in Fort Bend County, Texas. The town of Kendleton was founded in 1865 by freed slaves that bought land for as little as 50 cents an acre from a plantation owner named William Kendall. There are many families in Fort Bend County that can trace their lineage to the first African American slaves of the area. The project intends to celebrate the life of the first Fort Bend County resident slaves that established the town, churches, and cemeteries that belonged to them. This project will also invoke pride, and lift the spirits of the families and descendants of those who visit the park. Current Mayor of Kendleton, Mr. Darryl Humphrey, is a direct descendant of freed slaves and founding families of Kendleton, Texas. These grant funds can support future infrastructure, improvements critically needed for the successful construction of these proposed projects. Currently there is a need of wastewater, and sewer improvements to construct and preserve, and irrigate the projects that will highlight, support and pay homage to the preservation efforts for these historical gravesites located within the park. We currently have local support from area volunteers and preservationists to help clean up gravesites.
