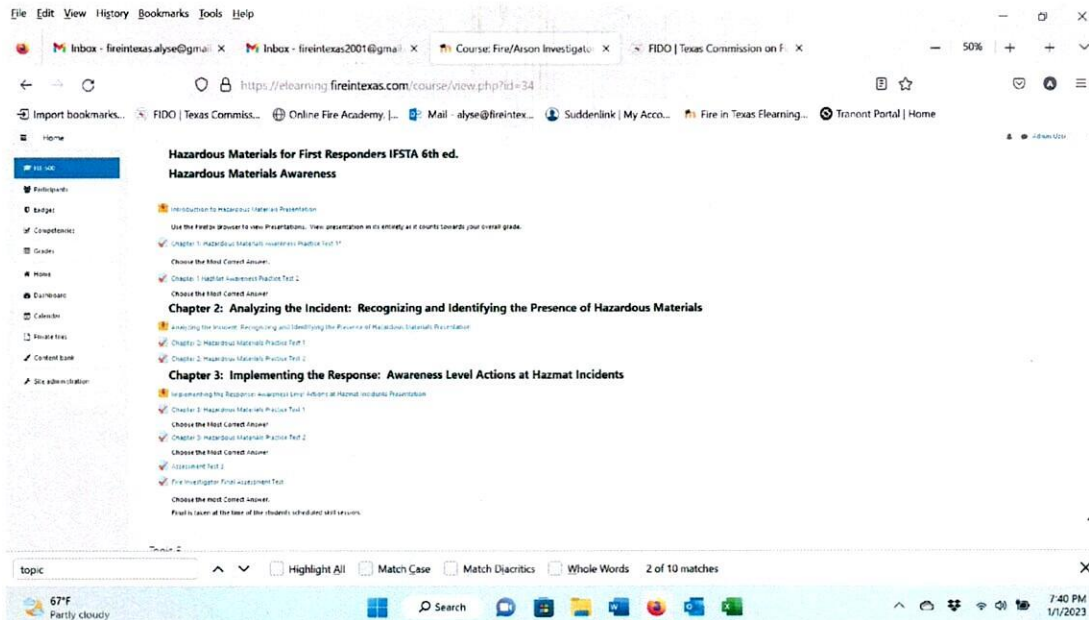
Click on Login in. When you type in your fire username and password all courses you are currently enrolled in will be listed.

## INSTRUCTION ON-LINE PORTION

The initial portion of training will consist of the on-line portion. The on-line portion will cover eighteen (18) chapters and three (3) chapters under the HazMat Topic. **ALL is required.** Each section will have a power point presentation, a self-study test.



The course shall be presented, and the student shall receive the training in order. The student shall not skip ahead to future chapters. Chapter 1 shall be the first chapter covered. Upon completion of the requirements of Chapter 1, the student shall begin Chapter 2 and so on. The presentation builds the terminology, procedures, and concepts as you progress through the program. If a student were to skip ahead, there may be confusion, due to an assumption that all previous materials had been covered.

**“IF” you are working on the course and you have a problem with the test, presentation, or quiz loading. Stop, contact us immediately, and start the next chapter so you don’t get behind. Contact: [dedee@fireintexas.com](mailto:dedee@fireintexas.com) or [andrea@fireintexas.com](mailto:andrea@fireintexas.com).**

Each student is allotted eight weeks to complete the on-line portion of the course. As mentioned above, there are eighteen chapters and three chapters for the hazmat section in this course. It is our recommendation that the student work towards the goal of completing three chapters each week. If this schedule is followed, ample time will be allotted to complete the course in the eight-week period and time will be allowed for overall review prior to attendance at the hands-on Skills Session.

**WARNING! Do NOT get behind!** If the student begins the program at a slower pace and the end date approaches, the material will not be studied and absorbed in a manner most beneficial to the student as the student accelerates to meet the deadline.

All on-line course work must be completed in full, or the student will NOT be allowed to attend the hands-on Skills Session as assigned. **This means ALL presentations, ALL practice exams and ALL Assessment Tests.**

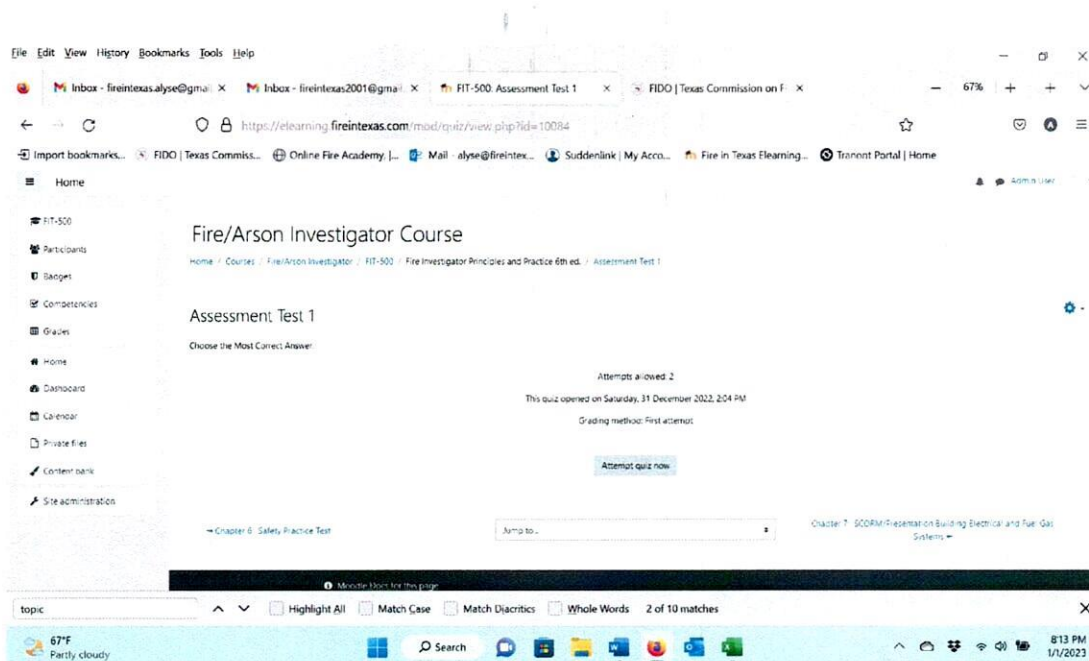

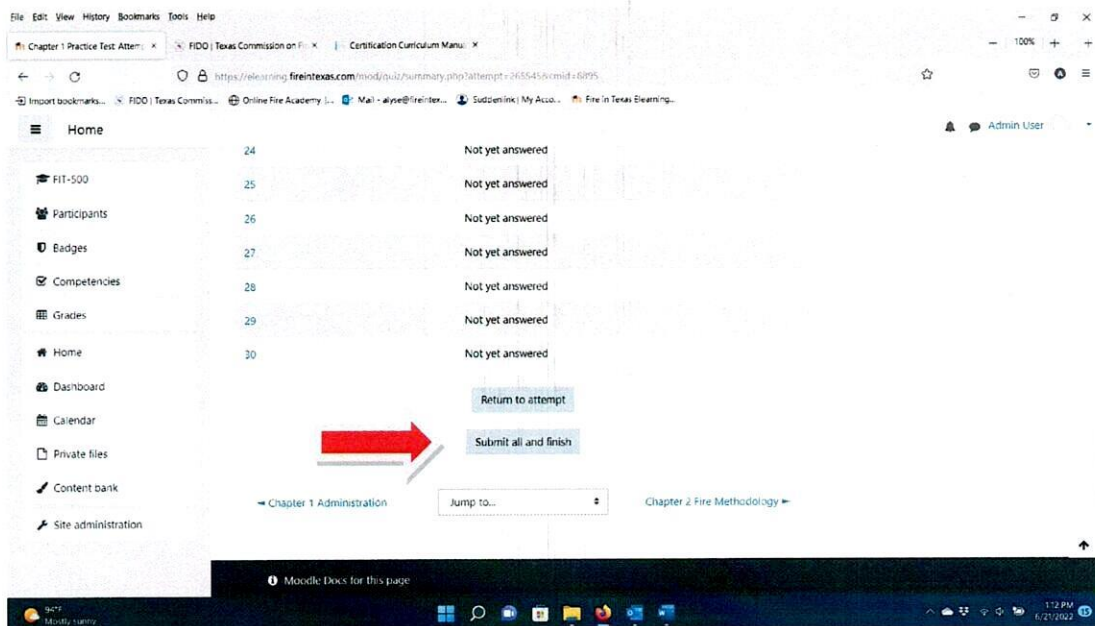

The student will find **Assessment tests** are **one (1)** attempt tests and must be passed with a 70 or above. \*\*You will notice that the course has both the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> edition HazMat material. The Commission has not updated to the 6<sup>th</sup> edition yet, but we are anticipating the revision. You do not have to complete both editions of HazMat coursework. Either/or is fine.

- The individual tests will be graded and recorded. The grades of these on-line
- Assessment tests will make up a portion of your overall grade for the course. A minimum passing score of 70% is required on **ALL** assessment tests. **All** practice tests must average a passing grade in order to continue on to the skill session.
- **Practice Test:** **Practice tests** have **unlimited** attempts; the **first attempt** is taken for score; all of the practice tests will be averaged together and must pass with a 70 or above. Once you have read your chapter and viewed the power point presentation you are ready to take your Practice Test. Some sections will not have a practice test.
- There are 3 Assessment Tests worth 30% of the student's grade. Students will have **2 attempts** at each assessment test with the first test score taken for grade. Assessment Tests must have a passing grade of 70%. So, if you fail your first attempt, please make sure you take the second attempt for a passing grade.

Students will receive 1-2 questions at a time. Select your answers, answers may be changed anytime throughout the quiz unless you click the “**Submit all and finish**” button. This will complete the students attempt and submit the practice test for grade.



The student may either return to the attempt to answer any unanswered questions or submit the test for grade. If a student is interrupted while making an attempt on a practice test, please click the “save without submitting” option. This will save your work. **Participation grades:** Participation grades **include** viewing of presentations, assignments, and participation at the skill session for state skills. If your grade for the participation of presentations is below 70% then you have **failed this section and will not be allowed to attend skills**. Each presentation must be viewed and if it is clicked through as, we know how much time is spent on each slide of each presentation and it is obvious that the presentation was just clicked through then you will not be allowed to attend skills.

**Assessment tests and Final Exam** must have a passing score of 70% or above to successfully complete and move onto the skill session.

**Practice tests** must have a 70% average to successfully complete and move onto the skill session.

Student dishonesty will NOT be allowed or tolerated. All work completed during this course must be completed by the student who signed up for the course. Any acts of dishonesty and/or cheating will be addressed, and the student may be dismissed from the course immediately.

## *Final Test*

**Final Test:** The final exam is proctored face-to-face at the beginning of your skills session. You will not have access to the final exam if you are not onsite for your skills session.

A minimum passing score of 70% is required on the practice tests, 70% or higher passing grade on all Assessment Tests AND 70% overall average on the presentations is required.

This also means if the Presentations are not completed, do not attempt to attend your skills session. The student will be asked to leave. The student must have an average of 70% or higher for the course once the Participation grades are added into the average to pass the course.
