# PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION FISCAL YEAR 2010 NEW FREEDOM PROJECT GRANT AGREEMENT

THIS PROJECT GRANT AGREEMENT (PGA) is made by and between the State of Texas, acting through the Texas Department of Transportation, hereinafter called the "State," and Ft. Bend County, hereinafter called the "Subrecipient."

#### WITNESSETH

**WHEREAS**, Transportation Code, Chapter 455, authorizes the State to assist the Subrecipient in procuring aid for the purpose of establishing and maintaining public and mass transportation projects and to administer funds appropriated for public transportation under Transportation Code, Chapter 456; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Subrecipient, as a 49 U.S.C. Section 5317 New Freedom provider, submitted a Project Proposal for financial assistance to be used to provide transportation services; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Texas Transportation Commission has approved Minute Order Number 111031; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Subrecipient must execute a *Fiscal Year 10 Grant Application, Part II* (GA Part II) at the start of each fiscal year grant period for consideration for state and/or federal grants; and,

**WHEREAS,** a *Master Grant Agreement (MGA)* between the Subrecipient, and the State has been adopted and states the general terms and conditions for grant projects developed through this PGA.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, the State and the Subrecipient hereto agree as follows:

#### AGREEMENT

# **ARTICLE 1. GRANT TIME PERIOD**

This PGA becomes effective when fully executed by both parties or on **March 1, 2010** whichever is later. This PGA shall remain in effect until **September 30, 2010**, unless terminated or otherwise modified in an Amendment. This PGA will not be considered fully executed until both parties have executed a MGA, and the Subrecipient has submitted the GA Part II (federal funds only) to the State. The time period of this PGA cannot be extended

past the MGA without exception. Any cost incurred before or after the contract period shall be ineligible for reimbursement.

# **ARTICLE 2. PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

The Subrecipient shall commence, carry out and complete the public transportation project described in the Attachment A, Approved Project Description (Attachment A) with all practicable dispatch, in a sound, economical and efficient manner.

The Subrecipient shall carryout the public transportation project described in the Attachment A in accordance with all of the documents associated with the MGA, and with all applicable federal and state laws and/or regulations.

If applicable, the Subrecipient shall begin competitive procurement procedures by issuing an invitation for bids or a request for proposals no later than sixty (60) days after the effective date of this grant agreement for the purchase of the approved line item(s) referenced in Attachment B, Approved Budget Page (Attachment B) and the Attachment C, Approved Project Budget (Attachment C). No later than sixty (60) days after the issuance of public notification, the Subrecipient shall publicly open all bids or privately review proposals. The Subrecipient shall enter into a binding agreement with a supplier no later than thirty (30) days after the opening of an acceptable bid or proposal. The Subrecipient shall notify the department in writing when it is necessary to exceed these deadlines.

### ARTICLE 3. COMPENSATION

The maximum amount payable under this PGA without modification is not to exceed Minute Order Number 111031 award of \$480,697 in Section 5317 funds, provided that expenditures are made in accordance with the amounts and for the purposes authorized in the Attachment A and Attachment B. This contract amount is less funds previously billed under Project Grant Agreement Number 5812F7074.

#### **ARTICLE 4. AMENDMENTS**

Except as noted in the MGA, changes in the scope, objectives, cost or duration of the project authorized herein shall be enacted by written amendment approved by the parties hereto before additional work may be performed or additional costs incurred. Any amendment so approved must be executed by both parties within the grant period specified in the MGA Article 1, Grant Time Period.

# ARTICLE 5. SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS

The Subrecipient binds themselves, their successors, assigns, executors and administrators in respect to all covenants of this agreement. The Subrecipient shall not sign, sublet or transfer their interest in this agreement without the written consent of the State.

#### ARTICLE 6. LEGAL CONSTRUCTION

In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this agreement shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision thereof and this agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

#### **ARTICLE 7. PRIOR AGREEMENTS**

This agreement constitutes the sole and only agreement of the parties hereto and supersedes any prior understandings or written or oral agreements between the parties respecting the public transportation grant specifically authorized and funded under this agreement.

#### ARTICLE 8. INCORPORATION OF PROVISIONS

Attachments are attached hereto and incorporated into this contract as if fully set forth herein.

#### ARTICLE 9. SIGNATORY WARRANTY

The undersigned signatory for the Subrecipient hereby represents and warrants that he or she is an officer of the organization for which he or she has executed this agreement and that he or she has full and complete authority to enter into this agreement on behalf of the organization.

#### ATTACHMENT A

### APPROVED PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Fort Bend County Transportation Department proposes development of coordinated mobility management and transit services to address gaps in access to services for people with disabilities residing in the rural areas of Fort Bend County. With the Geographical Access to Provider Services (GAPS) Project, mobility management will be utilized to coordinate the existing demand response services provided by Fort Bend County and other human service agency transportation service providers within the county.

Four new point deviation routes will be added to the existing public transportation services offered by Fort Bend County. Three of these routes will be assigned to expand services to rural sectors of the county. They will be operated as point deviation routes using both new pick up points and

connecting to existing pick up points already designated by Texana Center, a large disability services agency currently operating within the County. The fourth route will be designed as a comector/feeder route providing access to existing demand response and commuter services offered by Fort Bend County and the Houston Metropolitan Transit Authority.

To insure success of the GAPS Project and address coordination and access issues identified by the representatives of the disabled population in the community, the program will be complimented by the services of a Mobility Manager, a Trip Coordinator/Travel Trainer, and five Passenger Attendants. The Mobility Manager will be responsible for developing a comprehensive database listing all transportation services available in the County, identifying and contacting additional service providers, and carrying out all the processes necessary to complete coordination agreements among the agencies involved in the GAPS Project.

The Trip Coordinator will provide passengers with assistance in planning trips and will also provide "travel training," utilizing curriculum specifically designed to teach passengers with physical and cognitive disabilities how to access and utilize the varying transportation systems in the region. Five Passenger Attendants will be utilized to insure that individuals with disabilities board the correct vehicles, assist drivers with boarding and disembarking of passengers and, more importantly, insure individuals with disabilities who could not ordinarily wait unattended at pick up points are supervised. These complimentary functions will be designed specifically to accommodate the underserved citizens with disabilities residing in Fort Bend County.
