





Team,

We are reworking the employee benefits fund balance (9/30/2010) to identify additional surplus funds over the \$3m target fund balance. If we sell the clinic concept to the Court, we can propose to use employee benefits to fund the clinic with no additional funding from General (no 2011 budgetary impact). Regardless of whether there are additional surplus funds in employee benefits, we can propose to use a portion of the \$3m base fund balance to startup the clinic. Then the County can continue to fund employee benefits (clinic included) with the amount per budgeted position (\$9,500 currently). Then as the clinic produces savings, the employee benefits fund will enjoy the savings, thereby reducing future allocations per budgeted position. This method of funding should prevent the Court from getting hung up on seeding the clinic startup with current tax dollars. I can explain in more detail when we get together before the budget workshop.
