**AGREEMENT BETWEEN FORT BEND COUNTY
AND
FORT BEND COMMUNITY REVITALIZATION PROJECTS
FOR
FORT BEND COUNTY
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM**

THIS Agreement made and entered into by and between Fort Bend County, a body corporate and politic under the laws of the State of Texas (hereinafter referred to as the Grantee) and Fort Bend Community Revitalization Projects, a non-profit corporation under the laws of the State of Texas (hereinafter referred to as the Subrecipient).

WHEREAS, the Grantee has determined that housing rehabilitation assistance is needed by low- to moderate-income persons and has stated this need in its Consolidated Plan; and,

WHEREAS, Grantee, has entered into a Grant Agreement with the United States of America, No. B-10-UC-48-0004, acting by and through its Department of Housing and Urban Development (hereinafter referred to as HUD), for federal funding of a Community Development Block Grant Program (hereinafter referred to as CDBG) under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, amended; and

WHEREAS, included in the approved grant application was the rehabilitation of single-family owner-occupied housing units; and,

WHEREAS, the Grantee desires to promote activities that expand the supply of affordable housing and the development of partnerships among the Grantee, local governments, local lenders, private industry and nonprofit organizations; and,

WHEREAS, the Grantee wishes to engage the Subrecipient to assist the Grantee in utilizing such funds;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed between the parties hereto that;

I. SCOPE OF SERVICE

Activities

The Subrecipient will be responsible for administering a Program Year 2010 CDBG funded home repair program to low- to moderate-income homeowners in a manner satisfactory to the Grantee and consistent with any standards required as a condition of providing these funds. Such program will provide critically needed repairs to homes for eligible Fort Bend County residents who need repairs to their homes so they can remain in safe, sanitary, and decent housing.

Program Delivery

Subrecipient shall utilize its grant to provide home repairs at no charge to the homeowner, including activities that positively impact life, health, and safety matters. Such projects may include, but are not limited to, roof repair/replacement, plumbing and sewer repairs/replacements, electrical repair and flooring repair/replacement. Home remodeling, room additions and aesthetic improvements are not included. Subrecipient shall also utilize its grant to test for lead paint by certified and licensed professionals if the home repair activity will disturb an interior painted surface in excess of two (2) square feet or an exterior painted surface in excess of twenty (20) square feet. In addition, grant funds shall be used to provide administrative expenses for staffing costs, including fringe benefits.

General Administration

The Subrecipient or its Representatives shall be responsible for the administration of the home repair program.

National Objectives

The Subrecipient certifies that the activities carried out with funds provided under this Agreement will meet one or more of the CDBG's program's National Objectives - 1) benefit low/moderate income persons, 2) aid in the prevention or elimination of slums or blight, 3) meet community development needs having a particular urgency - as defined in 24 CFR Part 570.208.

Accomplishments

Subrecipient shall complete one or more of the following improvements on a minimum of Forty (40) separate owner-occupied housing units:

Activities

- 16 Roof repair/replacements
- 23 Interior repairs
- 5 Septic System Installations
- 8 Lead-based paint tests

Subrecipient shall spend no more than Five Thousand and No/100 dollars (\$5,000.00) on each address for roofs and interior work and no more than Ten Thousand and No/100 dollars (\$10,000.00) on septic systems. If a septic system is installed, no other work is allowed under this agreement.

Performance Monitoring

The Grantee will monitor the performance of the Subrecipient against accomplishments required herein. Substandard performance as determined by the Grantee will constitute non-compliance with this Agreement. If action to correct such substandard performance

is not taken by the Subrecipient within a reasonable period of time after being notified by the Grantee, Agreement suspension or termination procedures will be initiated.

The Subrecipient shall assist the Grantee in measuring program impact to determine the extent to which the activities yield the desired outcomes in the community or in the lives of persons assisted. The Subrecipient shall assist the Grantee in selecting indicators that relate to the local goals established in the Consolidated Plan.

II. TIME OF PERFORMANCE

Services of the Subrecipient shall begin January 1, 2011 and end on December 31, 2011.

IV. PAYMENT

It is expressly agreed and understood that the total amount to be paid by the Grantee under this Agreement shall not exceed Two Hundred Twenty Five Thousand and No/100 dollars (\$225,000.00). Drawdowns for the payment of eligible expenses shall be made on an as needed-basis against the budget specified herein and in accordance with performance. Subrecipient may submit a reimbursement request on a weekly basis for housing rehabilitation and repair costs. Subrecipient shall submit a reimbursement

request on or before the fifteenth day of the month for the costs incurred during the preceding month for administrative items. All invoices shall include any other documentation requested by the Grantee. All invoices shall be approved by the Fort Bend County Community Development Department prior to payment.

Payments may be contingent upon certification of the Subrecipient's financial management system in accordance with the standards specified in OMB Circular A-110.

V. NOTICES

VI. SPECIAL CONDITIONS

The Subrecipient agrees to comply with the requirements of Title 24 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 570 of the Housing and Urban Development regulations concerning Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) and all federal regulations and policies issued pursuant to these regulations. The Subrecipient further agrees to utilize funds available under this Agreement to supplement rather than supplant funds otherwise available.

VII. GENERAL CONDITIONS

A. General Compliance

The Subrecipient agrees to comply with all applicable Federal, state and local laws and regulations governing the funds provided under this Agreement.

B. Independent Contractor

Nothing contained in this Agreement is intended to, or shall be construed in any manner, as creating or establishing the relationship of employer/employee between the parties. The Subrecipient shall at all times remain an independent contractor with respect to the services to be performed under this Agreement. The Grantee shall be exempt from payment of all Unemployment Compensation, FICA, retirement, life and/or medical

insurance and Workers' Compensation Insurance as the Subrecipient is an independent Subrecipient.

C. Hold Harmless

The Subrecipient shall hold harmless, defend and indemnify the Grantee from any and all claims, actions, suits, charges and judgments whatsoever that arise out of the Subrecipient's performance or nonperformance of the services or subject matter called for in this Agreement.

D. Workers' Compensation

The Subrecipient shall provide Workers' Compensation Insurance coverage for all employees involved in the performance of this Agreement.

E. Insurance & Bonding

The Subrecipient shall carry sufficient insurance coverage to protect contractor's assets from loss due to theft, fraud and/or undue physical damage, and as a minimum, shall purchase a blanket fidelity bond covering all employees in an amount equal to cash advances from the Grantee.

The Subrecipient shall comply with the bonding and insurance requirements of OMB Circular A-110, Bonding and Insurance.

F. Grantor Recognition

The Subrecipient shall insure recognition of the role of the grantor agency in providing services through this Agreement. All activities, facilities and items utilized pursuant to this Agreement shall be prominently labeled as to funding source. In addition, the Subrecipient will include a reference to the support provided herein in all publications made possible with funds made available under this Agreement.

G. Amendments

The Subrecipient and the Grantee, through its Director of the Fort Bend County Community Development Department may, by prior written agreement, mutually agree to re-allocate the funds among the various line items of the budget or to new line items created in the budget.

Grantee or Subrecipient may amend this Agreement at any time provided that such amendments make specific reference to this Agreement, and are executed in writing, signed by a duly authorized representative of both organizations, and approved by the Grantee's governing body. Such amendments shall not invalidate this Agreement, nor relieve or release Grantee or Subrecipient from its obligations under this Agreement.

Grantee may, in its discretion, amend this Agreement to conform with federal, state or local governmental guidelines, policies and available funding amounts, or for other reasons. If such amendments result in a change in the funding, the scope of services, or schedule of, the activities to be undertaken as part of this Agreement, such modifications will be incorporated only by written amendment signed by both Grantee and Subrecipient.

H. Suspension or Termination

Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving written notice to the other party of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof at least thirty (30) days before the effective date of such termination. Partial terminations of the Scope of Service in Paragraph I.A. above may only be undertaken with the prior approval of Grantee. In the event of any termination for convenience, all finished or unfinished documents, data, studies, surveys, maps, models, photographs, reports or other materials prepared by Subrecipient under this Agreement shall, at the option of the Grantee, become the property of the Grantee, and Subrecipient shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any satisfactory work completed on such documents or materials prior to the termination, subject to the provisions and limitation of Paragraph IV.

Grantee may also suspend or terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part, if Subrecipient materially fails to comply with any term of this Agreement, or with any of the rules, regulations or provisions referred to herein; and the Grantee may declare the Subrecipient ineligible for any further participation in Grantee Agreements, in addition to other remedies as provided by law. In the event there is probable cause to believe the Subrecipient is in noncompliance with any applicable rules or regulations, the Grantee may withhold up to fifteen percent (15%) of said Agreement funds until such time as the Subrecipient is found to be in compliance by the Grantee, or is otherwise adjudicated to be in compliance.

VIII. ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS

A. Financial Management

1. Accounting Standards

The Subrecipient agrees to comply with OMB Circular A-110 and agrees to adhere to the accounting principles and procedures required therein, utilize adequate internal controls, and maintain necessary source documentation for all costs incurred.

2. Cost Principles

The Subrecipient shall administer its program in conformance with OMB Circulars A-122, "Cost Principles for Non-Profit Organizations," or A-21, "Cost Principles for Educational Institutions," as applicable; for all costs incurred whether charged on a direct or indirect basis.

B. Documentation and Record-Keeping

1. Records to be Maintained

The Subrecipient shall maintain all records required by the federal regulations specified in 24 CFR Part 570.506, and that are pertinent to the activities to be funded under this Agreement. Such records shall include, but not be limited to:

- a. Records providing a full description of each activity undertaken;
- b. Records demonstrating that each activity undertaken meets one of the National Objectives of the CDBG program;
- c. Records required to determine the eligibility of activities;
- d. Records required to document the acquisition, improvement, use or disposition of real property acquired or improved with CDBG assistance;
- e. Records demonstrating compliance with citizen participation requirements;
- f. Records demonstrating compliance regarding acquisition, displacement, relocation, and replacement housing;
- g. Records documenting compliance with the fair housing and equal opportunity components of the CDBG program;
- h. Financial records as required by 24 CFR Part 570.502;
- i. Agreements and other records related to lump sum disbursements to private financial institutions financing rehabilitation as prescribed in 570.513; and
- j. Records required to be maintained in with other applicable laws and regulations set forth in subpart K of 24 CFR 570.

2. Retention

The Subrecipient shall retain all records pertinent to expenditures incurred under this Agreement for a period of four (4) years after the termination of all activities funded under this Agreement, or after the resolution of all Federal audit findings, whichever occurs later. Records for non-expendable property acquired with funds under this Agreement shall be retained for four (4) years from receipt of final payment.

3. Reports

The Subrecipient shall furnish reports to the Grantee which include, but may not be limited to, the following:

- A. Client Data Reports submitted monthly to Grantee.
- B. Client Data Summary Reports submitted monthly to Grantee.
- C. Employee Data Reports submitted monthly to Grantee.
- D. Performance Report submitted at the end of Agreement period.

Monthly reports shall be submitted within fifteen (15) working days of the end of the reporting periods. The performance report is due within thirty (30) working days after the end of the Agreement period.

4. Reversion of Assets

The Subrecipient shall transfer to the Grantee any CDBG funds on hand at the time of expiration and any accounts receivable attributable to the use of CDBG funds. Any real property that was acquired or improved in whole or in part with CDBG funds in excess of \$25,000 must continue to meet the eligibility criteria and shall conform with the “changes in use” restrictions specified in 24 CFR 570.503(b)(8).

5. Property Records

The Subrecipient shall maintain real property inventory records which clearly identify properties purchased, improved or sold. Properties retained shall continue to meet eligibility criteria and shall conform with the “changes in use” restrictions specified in 24 CFR 570.503(b)(8).

6. National Objectives

The Subrecipient agrees to maintain documentation that demonstrates that the activities carried out with funds provided under this Agreement meet one or more of the CDBG program's national objectives - 1) benefit low/moderate income persons, 2) aid in the prevention or elimination of slums or blight, 3) meet community development needs having a particular urgency - as defined in 24 CFR Part 570.208.

7. Close-outs

Subrecipient obligation to the Grantee shall not end until all close-out requirements are completed. Activities during this close-out period shall include, but are not limited to; making final payments, disposing of program assets (including the return of all unused materials, equipment, unspent cash advances, program income balances, and receivable accounts to the Grantee), and determining the custodianship of records.

8. Audits & Inspections

All Subrecipient records with respect to any matters covered by this Agreement shall be made available to the Grantee, grantor agency, their designees or the Federal Government, at any time during normal business hours, as often as the Grantee or grantor agency deems necessary, to audit, examine, and make excerpts or transcripts of all relevant data. Any deficiencies noted in audit reports must be resolved to the satisfaction of Grantee by the Subrecipient within thirty (30) days after receipt of audit by the Subrecipient. Failure of the Subrecipient to comply with the above audit requirements will constitute a violation of this Agreement and may result in the withholding of future payments. The Subrecipient hereby agrees to have an annual agency audit conducted in accordance with current Grantee policy concerning Subrecipient audits.

C. Reporting & Payment Procedures

1. Budgets

The Subrecipient has submitted a budget to the Grantee. The Grantee and the Subrecipient may agree to revise the budget from time to time in accordance with existing Grantee policies.

2. Program Income

The Subrecipient shall report monthly all program income as defined at 24 CFR 570.500(a) generated by activities carried out with CDBG funds made available under this Agreement. The use of program income by the Subrecipient shall comply with the requirements set forth at 24 CFR 570.504(c). By way of further limitations, the Subrecipient may use such income during the Agreement period for activities permitted under this Agreement and shall reduce requests for additional funds by the amount of any such program income balances on hand. All unused program income shall be returned to the Grantee at the end of the Agreement period as specified in 24 CFR 570.503(b)(8). Any interest earned on cash advances from the U.S. Treasury is not program income and shall be remitted promptly to the Grantee.

3. Indirect Costs

If indirect costs are charged, the Subrecipient will develop an indirect cost allocation plan for determining the appropriate Grantee share of administrative costs and shall submit such plan to the Grantee for approval.

4. Payment Procedures

The Grantee will pay to the Subrecipient funds available under this Agreement based upon information submitted by the Subrecipient and consistent with any approved budget and Grantee policy concerning payments in accordance with Paragraph IV. With the exception of certain advances, payments will be made for eligible expenses actually incurred by the Subrecipient. Payments will be adjusted by the Grantee in accordance with advance fund and program income balances available in Subrecipient accounts. In addition, the Grantee reserves the right to liquidate funds available under this Agreement for costs incurred by the Grantee on behalf of the Subrecipient.

D. Procurement

1. Compliance

The Subrecipient shall comply with current Grantee policy concerning the purchase of equipment and shall maintain inventory records of all non-expendable personal property as defined by such policy as may be procured with funds provided herein. Any real property under Subrecipient's control that was acquired or improved in whole or in part with CDBG funds must either be:

- a. Used by the Subrecipient to meet one of the national objectives in 24 CFR 570.200(a)(2) and (3) until five (5) years after expiration or termination of the Grantee's Agreement with HUD; or
- b. Transferred to the Grantee; or
- c. Disposed of in a manner that results in the amount of the then current fair market value of the property less any portion thereof attributable to expenditures of non-CDBG funds for acquisition thereof, or improvements to, the property being reimbursed to the Grantee. Such reimbursement is not required if disposed of more than five (5) years after the expiration or termination of this Agreement.
- d. Further, if within five (5) years of the termination or expiration of this Agreement, the Subrecipient ceases to use any or all personal property attributable to CDBG funds to meet a national objective, the personal property shall either revert to the Grantee or be

- disposed of in accordance with the applicable federal rules and regulations, including, but not limited to OMB Circular A-110,
- e. The Grantee, in its sole discretion, shall determine whether the Subrecipient use of any property meets a national objective contained in 24 CFR 570.200 (a)(2) and (3).
 - f. After the expiration of five (5) years, the Subrecipient shall have no obligation to comply with this section regarding real or personal property.
 - g. Nothing contained herein shall be construed to conflict with the duties of the Subrecipient as set forth in the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act (Tex. Ann. Civ. St. Art. 1396-1.01, et seq.) or any other applicable statute.

2. OMB Standards

The Subrecipient shall procure materials in accordance with the requirements of OMB Circular A-110, Procurement Standards, and shall subsequently follow Property Management Standards, covering utilization and disposal of property.

3. Travel

The Subrecipient shall obtain written approval from the Grantee for any travel outside the metropolitan area with funds provided under this Agreement.

4. Relocation, Acquisition & Displacement

The Subrecipient agrees to comply with 24 CFR 570.606 relating to the acquisition and disposition of all real property utilizing grant funds, and to the displacement of persons, businesses, nonprofit organizations and farms occurring as a direct result of any acquisition of real property utilizing grant funds. The Subrecipient agrees to comply with applicable Grantee Ordinances, Resolutions, and Policies concerning displacement of individuals from their residences.

IX. PERSONNEL & PARTICIPANT CONDITIONS

A. Civil Rights

1. Compliance

The Subrecipient agrees to comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 as amended, Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 as amended, Section 109 of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, Executive Order 11063 as amended by Executive Order 12259.

2. Nondiscrimination

The Subrecipient will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, creed, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, disability or other handicap, age, marital status, or status with regard to public assistance. The Subrecipient will take affirmative action to insure that all employment practices are free from such discrimination. Such employment practices include, but are not limited to, the following: hiring, upgrading, demotion, transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff, termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Subrecipient agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the contracting agency setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

3. Land Covenants

This Agreement is subject to the requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (P.L. 88-352) and 24 CFR 570, Part I. In regard to the sale, lease, or other transfer of land acquired, cleared or improved with assistance provided under this Agreement, the Subrecipient shall cause or require a covenant running with the land to be inserted in the deed or lease for such transfer, prohibiting discrimination as herein defined, in the sale, lease or rental, or in the use or occupancy of such land, or in any improvements erected or to be erected thereon, providing that the Grantee and the United States are beneficiaries of and entitled to enforce such covenants. The Subrecipient, in undertaking its obligation to carry out the program assisted hereunder, agrees to take such measures as are necessary to enforce such covenant, and will not itself so discriminate.

4. Section 504

The Subrecipient agrees to comply with any federal regulations issued pursuant to compliance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, (29 U.S.C. 706) which prohibits discrimination against the handicapped in any federally assisted program. The Grantee shall provide the Subrecipient with any guidelines necessary for compliance with that portion of the regulations in force during the term of this Agreement.

B. Affirmative Action

1. Approved Plan

The Subrecipient agrees that it shall be committed to carry out pursuant to the Grantee's specifications, an Affirmative Action Program in keeping with the principles as provided in President's Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965. The Grantee shall provide Affirmative Action guidelines to the

Subrecipient to assist in the formulation of such program. The Subrecipient shall submit a plan for an Affirmative Action program for approval prior to the award of funds.

2. W/MBE

The Subrecipient will use its best efforts to afford minority and women-owned business enterprises the maximum practicable opportunity to participate in the performance of this Agreement. As used in this Agreement, the term "minority and female business enterprise" means a business at least fifty-one percent (51%) owned and controlled by minority group members or women. For the purpose of this definition, "minority group members" are Afro-Americans, Spanish-speaking, Spanish surnamed or Spanish-heritage Americans, Asian-Americans, and American Indians. The Subrecipient may rely on written representations by Subrecipients regarding their status as minority and female business enterprises in lieu of an independent investigation.

3. Access to Records

The Subrecipient shall furnish and cause each of its sub-Subrecipients to furnish all information and reports required hereunder and will permit access to its books, records and accounts by the Grantee, HUD or its agent, or other authorized federal officials for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with the rules, regulations and provisions stated herein.

4. Notifications

The Subrecipient will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other Agreement or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the agency Contracting officer, advising the labor union or worker's representative of the Subrecipient's commitments hereunder, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

5. EEO/AA Statement

The Subrecipient will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Subrecipient, state that it is an Equal Opportunity or Affirmative Action employer.

6. SubAgreement Provisions

The Subrecipient will include the provisions of Paragraphs VIII A, Civil Rights, and B, Affirmative Action, in every SubAgreement or purchase order, specifically or by reference, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subSubrecipient or vendor.

C. Employment Restrictions

1. Prohibited Activity

The Subrecipient is prohibited from using funds provided herein or personnel employed in the administration of the program for political activities; sectarian, or religious activities; lobbying, political patronage, and nepotism activities.

2. OSHA

Where employees are engaged in activities not covered under the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, they shall not be required or permitted to work, be trained, or receive services in buildings or surroundings or under working conditions which are unsanitary, hazardous or dangerous to the participant's health or safety.

3. Labor Standards

The Subrecipient agrees to comply with the requirements of the Secretary of Labor in accordance with the Davis-Bacon Act as amended, the provisions of Agreement Work Hours, the Safety Standards Act, the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (40 U.S.C. 276, 327-333) and all other applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations pertaining to labor standards insofar as those acts apply to the performance of this Agreement. The Subrecipient shall maintain documentation which demonstrates compliance with hour and wage requirements of this part. Such documentation shall be made available to the Grantee for review upon request.

The Subrecipient agrees that, except with respect to the rehabilitation or construction of residential property designed for residential use for less than eight (8) households, all Contractors engaged under Agreements in excess of \$2,000.00 for construction, renovation or repair of any building or work financed in whole or in part with assistance provided under this Agreement, shall comply with federal requirements adopted by the Grantee pertaining to such Agreements and with the applicable requirements of the regulations of the Department of Labor, under 29 CFR, Parts 3, 1, 5 and 7 governing the payment of wages and ratio of apprentices and trainees to journeymen; provided, that if wage rates higher than those required under the regulations are imposed by state or local law, nothing hereunder is

intended to relieve the Subrecipient of its obligation, if any, to require payment of the higher wage. The Subrecipient shall cause or require to be inserted in full, in all such Agreements subject to such regulations, provisions meeting the requirements of this paragraph, for such Agreements subject to such regulations, provisions meeting the requirements of this paragraph, for such Agreements in excess of \$10,000.00.

The Subrecipient shall also comply with 24 CFR Part 70 which sets out the circumstances under which individuals who volunteer their services may be used.

5. "Section 3" Clause

a. Compliance

Compliance with the provisions of Section 3, the regulations set forth in 24 CFR 135, and all applicable rules and orders issued hereunder prior to the execution of this Agreement, shall be a condition of the federal financial assistance provided under this Agreement and binding upon the Grantee, the Subrecipient and any subSubrecipients. Failure to fulfill these requirements shall subject the Grantee, the Subrecipient and any subSubrecipients, their successors and assigns, to those sanctions specified. Subrecipient certifies and agrees that no contractual or other disability exists which would prevent compliance with these requirements.

The Subrecipient further agrees to comply with these "Section 3" requirements and to include the following language in all SubAgreements executed under this Agreement:

"The work to be performed under this Agreement is a project assisted under a program providing direct federal financial assistance from HUD and is subject to the requirements of Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended, 12 U.S.C. 1701. Section 3 requires that to the greatest extent feasible opportunities for training and employment be given to lower income residents of the project area and Agreements for work in connection with the project be awarded to business concerns which are located in, or owned in substantial part by persons residing in the areas of the project."

The Subrecipient certifies and agrees that no contractual or other disability exists which would prevent compliance with the requirements.

b. Notifications

The Subrecipient agrees to send to each labor organization or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other Agreement or understanding, if any, a notice advising said labor organization or worker's representative of its commitments under this Section 3 clause and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment or training.

c. SubAgreements

The Subrecipient will include this Section 3 clause in every SubAgreement and will take appropriate action pursuant to the SubAgreement upon a finding that the subSubrecipient is in violation of regulations issued by the Grantor Agency. The Subrecipient will not SubAgreement with any subSubrecipient where it has notice or knowledge that the latter has been found in violation of regulations under 24 CFR 135 and will not let any SubAgreement unless the subSubrecipient has first provided it with a preliminary statement of ability to comply with the requirements of these regulations.

D. Conduct

1. Assignability

The Subrecipient shall not assign or transfer any interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the Grantee thereto; provided, however, that claims for money due or to become due to the Subrecipient from the Grantee under this Agreement may be assigned to a bank, trust company, or other financial institution without such approval. Notice of any such assignment or transfer shall be furnished promptly to the Grantee.

2. Hatch Act

The Subrecipient agrees that no funds provided, nor personnel employed under this Agreement, shall be in any way or to any extent engaged in the conduct of political activities in violation of Chapter 15 of Title V United States Code.

3. Conflict of Interest

The Subrecipient agrees to abide by the provisions of 24 CFR 570.611 with respect to conflicts of interest, and covenants that it presently has no persons who exercise or have exercised any functions or responsibilities with respect to CDBG

activities or who are in a position to participate in a decision-making process or gain inside information with regard to such activities, may obtain a financial interest or benefit from a CDBG-assisted activity, either for themselves or those with whom they have business or immediate family ties, during their tenure or for one year thereafter. The Subrecipient further covenants that, in the performance of this Agreement, no person having such a financial interest shall be employed or retained by the Subrecipient hereunder. These conflict of interest provisions apply to any person who is an employee, agent, consultant, officer, or elected official or appointed official of the Grantee, or of any designated public agencies or subrecipients which are receiving funds under the CDBG Entitlement program.

4. Eligibility Restrictions for Certain Resident Aliens

The Subrecipient agrees to abide by the provisions of 24 CFR 570.613 with respect to the eligibility restrictions for certain resident aliens. Certain newly legalized aliens, as described in 24 CFR Part 49, are not eligible to apply for benefits under covered activities funded by the programs listed in this part of the regulation. The Grantee shall provide the Subrecipient with any guidelines necessary for compliance with that portion of the regulation.

5. Architectural Barriers Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act

The Subrecipient agrees to comply with any federal regulations issued pursuant to compliance with the Architectural Barriers Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 4151-4157) which requires certain Federal and Federally funded buildings and other facilities to be designed, constructed, or altered in accordance with the standards that insure accessibility to, and use by, physically handicapped people. The Subrecipient also agrees to comply with any federal regulations issued pursuant to compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. 12131 U.S.C. 155, 201, 218 and 225) which provides comprehensive civil rights to individuals with disabilities in the areas of employment, public accommodations, State and local government services, and telecommunications. The Grantee shall provide the Subrecipient with any guidelines necessary for compliance with that portion of the regulation in force during the term of this Agreement.

6. SubAgreements

a. Approvals

The Subrecipient shall not enter into any SubAgreements with any agency or individual in the performance of this Agreement without the written consent of the Grantee prior to the execution of such agreement.

b. Monitoring

The Subrecipient will monitor all subcontracted services on a regular basis to assure Agreement compliance. Results of monitoring efforts shall be summarized in written reports and supported with documented evidence of follow-up actions taken to correct areas of noncompliance.

c. Content

The Subrecipient shall cause all of the provisions of this Agreement in its entirety to be included in and made a part of any SubAgreement executed in the performance of this Agreement.

d. Selection Process

The Subrecipient shall undertake to insure that all SubAgreements let in the performance of this Agreement shall be awarded on a fair and open competition basis. Executed copies of all SubAgreements shall be forwarded to the Grantee along with documentation concerning the selection process.

7. Copyright

If this Agreement results in any copyrightable material, the Grantee and/or grantor agency reserves the right to royalty-free, non-exclusive and irrevocable license to reproduce, publish or otherwise use and to authorize others to use, the work for government purposes.

8. Religious Organization

The Subrecipient agrees that funds provided under this Agreement will not be utilized for religious activities, to promote religious interests, or for the benefit of a religious organization in accordance with the federal regulations specified in 24 CFR 570.200(j).

X. ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS

A. Air and Water

The Subrecipient agrees to comply with the following regulations insofar as they apply to the performance of this Agreement:

- Clean Air Act, 42 U.S.C., 1857, et seq.
- Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C. 1251, et seq., as amended 1318 relating to inspection, monitoring, entry, reports, and information, as well as other requirements specified in said Section 114 and Section 308, and all regulations and guidelines issued thereunder.

- Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations pursuant to 40 CFR, Part 50, as amended.
- National Environmental Policy Act of 1969.
- HUD Environmental Review Procedures (24 CFR, Part 58).

B. Flood Disaster Protection

The Subrecipient agrees to comply with the requirements of the Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973 (P.L.-2234) in regard to the sale, lease or other transfer of land acquired, cleared or improved under the terms of this Agreement, as it may apply to the provisions of this Agreement.

C. Lead-Based Paint

The Subrecipient agrees that any construction or rehabilitation of residential structures with assistance provided under this Agreement shall be subject to HUD Lead-Based Paint Regulations at 24 CFR 570.608, and 24 CFR Part 35, and in particular Sub-Part B thereof. Such regulations pertain to all HUD-assisted housing and require that all owners, prospective owners, and tenants or properties constructed prior to 1978 be properly notified that such properties may include lead-based paint. Such notification shall point out the hazards of lead-based paint and explain the symptoms, treatment and precautions that should be taken when dealing with lead-based paint poisoning.

D. Historic Preservation

The Subrecipient agrees to comply with the Historic Preservation requirements set forth in the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended (16 U.S.C. 470) and the procedures set forth in 36 CFR, Part 800, Advisory Council on Historic Preservation Procedures for Protection of Historic Properties, insofar as they apply to the performance of this Agreement.

In general, this requires concurrence from the Texas Historical Commission for all rehabilitation and demolition of historic properties that are fifty (50) years old or older or that are included on a Federal, State, or local historic property list.

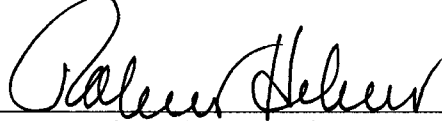
XI. SEVERABILITY

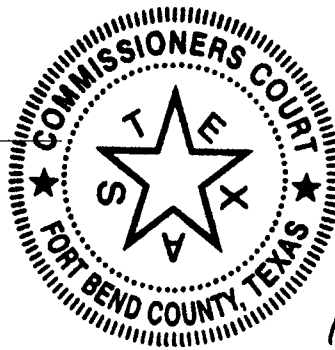

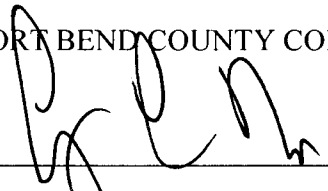

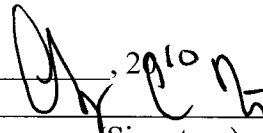
