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ADDENDUM TO NOVELL GROUPWISE TO MICROSOFT <u>EXCHANGE MIGRATION AGREEMENT</u>

THIS AMENDMENT is entered into by and between Fort Bend County, a body corporate and politic, and The Harding Group, Inc., a company authorized to conduct business in the State of Texas.

THAT, WHEREAS, the parties have executed and accepted that certain Novell GroupWise to Microsoft Exchange Migration Agreement, (hereinafter the "Agreement"), attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated by reference; and

WHEREAS, the following changes are incorporated as if a part of the Agreement:

- 1. **Time of Performance.** It is understood and agreed that the time for performance of the Scope of Services under this Agreement shall begin with receipt of the Notice to Proceed and end no later than ten (10) weeks thereafter.
- 2. Applicable Law. This Agreement shall be construed under and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and all obligations of the parties created hereunder are performable in Fort Bend County, Texas. Venue shall lie in Fort Bend County, Texas, for any suit regarding this agreement.
- Indemnity. The parties agree that under the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, Fort Bend County cannot enter into an agreement whereby Fort Bend County agrees to indemnify or hold harmless another party; therefore, all references of any kind to defending, indemnifying, holding or saving harmless for any reason are hereby deleted. The penalties and remedies provided by agreement do not limit common law remedies of tort, contract, or equity, including a suit for damages, injunction, or mandamus.
- 4. **Attorney Fees.** Fort Bend County does not agree to pay any and/or all attorney fees incurred by The Harding Group, Inc. in any way associated with this agreement.
- 5. **Arbitration.** Fort Bend County does not agree to submit disputes arising out of the Agreement to binding arbitration. Therefore, any references to binding arbitration or the waiver of a right to litigate a dispute are hereby deleted.
- 6. Taxes. Fort Bend County, Texas, is a body corporate and politic under the laws of the State of Texas and claims exemption from sales and use taxes. A copy of a tax-exempt certificate will be furnished upon request.
- 7. Confidential Information. The Harding Group, Inc. expressly acknowledges that Fort Bend County is subject to the Texas Public Information Act, TEX. GOV'T CODE ANN. §§ 552.001 et seq., as amended, and notwithstanding any provision in the Agreement to the contrary, Fort Bend County will make any information related to the Agreement, or otherwise, available to third parties in accordance with the Texas Public Information Act. Any proprietary or confidential information marked as such provided to Fort Bend County by The Harding Group, Inc. shall not be disclosed to any third party, except as directed

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- by the Texas Attorney General in response to a request for such under the Texas Public Information Act, which provides for notice to the owner of such marked information and the opportunity for the owner of such information to notify the Attorney General of the reasons why such information should not be disclosed.
- 8. Insurance. Prior to commencement of the Services, The Harding Group, Inc. shall furnish Fort Bend County with evidence of all insurance required and provide that such insurance shall not be canceled, except on 30 days' prior written notice to Fort Bend County. The Harding Group, Inc. shall maintain such insurance coverage from the time Services commence until Services are completed. The Harding Group, Inc. shall obtain such insurance written on an Occurrence form from such companies having Bests rating of A/VII or better, licensed or approved to transact business in the State of Texas.
 - a. The Harding Group, Inc. shall obtain such insurance of the following types and minimum limits:
 - i. Workers' Compensation insurance in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. Substitutes to genuine Workers' Compensation Insurance will not be allowed.
 - ii. Employers' Liability insurance with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per injury by accident, \$1,000,000 per injury by disease, and \$1,000,000 per bodily injury by disease.
 - iii. Commercial general liability insurance with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence and \$2,000,000 in the annual aggregate. Policy shall cover liability for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage and products/completed operations arising out of the business operations of the policyholder.
 - iv. Business Automobile Liability insurance with a combined Bodily Injury/Property Damage limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each accident. The policy shall cover liability arising from the operation of licensed vehicles by policyholder.
 - v. Information technology liability insurance with limits not less than \$1,000,000.
 - b. Fort Bend County and the members of Commissioners Court shall be named as additional insured to all required coverage. All Liability policies written on behalf of The Harding Group, Inc. shall contain a waiver of subrogation in favor of Fort Bend County and members of Commissioners Court
 - c. If required coverage is written on a claims-made basis, The Harding Group, Inc. warrants that any retroactive date applicable to coverage under the policy precedes the effective date of the contract; and that continuous coverage will be maintained or an extended discovery period will be exercised for a period of 2 years beginning from the time that work under the Agreement is completed.
- 9. Independent Contractor. In the performance of work or services hereunder, The Harding Group, Inc. shall be deemed an independent contractor, and any of its agents, employees, officers, or volunteers performing work required hereunder shall be deemed solely as employees of The Harding Group, Inc. or, where permitted, of its subcontractors. The Harding Group, Inc. and its agents, employees, officers, or volunteers shall not, by performing work pursuant to this



Agreement, be deemed to be employees, agents, or servants of Fort Bend County and shall not be entitled to any of the privileges or benefits of Fort Bend County employment.

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2 Executive Summary

SACT NOTE

The Harding Group, Inc. would like to thank Fort Bend County for the opportunity to provide a proposal with our recommendations and implementation services, for a migration of approximately 2000 user mailboxes, from Novell GroupWise to Microsoft Exchange.

There are several strategies available when considering a mail migration project. These are:

Hard Cutover - This method is rather harsh, as it involves the sudden change from one messaging system to another, with no centralized effort to migrate mailbox data. Users can be instructed to export their mail and contacts, and import it into their Exchange mailbox, but no server to server communication would be involved.

This method would be the least expensive option, as it involves no tools and minimal consulting services. However, it is not seen as the most viable decision in most circumstances.

Coexistence - The most complex and costly scenario is the coexistence of both Exchange and Novell GroupWise. Each system is capable of delivering mail for a given DNS name and needs to know which system hosts which mailboxes. Special mail routing rules have to be created, and maintained, on each system as well. Two separate email archives, SPAM, and virus protection (unless this anti-X solution is hosted in the cloud and is the first hop in inbound mail routing) will have to be maintained as well.

This method works best in large mail organizations that cannot afford to backfill a new mail infrastructure with legacy data.

Dialtone or Backfill Cutover — In this scenario, a hard switch still occurs on a predetermined date. All new inbound mail flows to Exchange rather than Novell GroupWise, and Novell GroupWise is prevented from sending mail. Users start with an empty mailbox, but there is a centralized effort to migrate some, or all, mailbox data from the legacy system. Fort Bend County can decide to migrate as many users and mail messages or folders deemed necessary, as well as any part of a Novell GroupWise mailbox needed.

This strategy is an effective middle ground, between the high costs of running concurrent systems, and the drastic nature of a hard cutover. It involves the purchase of specialized software tools, several dedicated workstations to perform the mailbox migrations, as well as substantial consulting assistance to perform the migration.

The Harding Group, Inc. recommends this approach for a mail system migration for Fort Bend County.

The Harding Group, Inc. understands that Fort Bend County requires that all existing email, calendar items, tasks, contacts, etc., currently found in Novell GroupWise must be migrated to the new Exchange system. HGI recommends the use of the Novell GroupWise Migrator for Exchange software by Quest be used to ensure a reliable migration of data from Novell GroupWise to Exchange.

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It is worth noting that any migration strategy will negate the single message store functionality of Exchange, as emails and attachments will be migrated piecemeal, and will therefore be stored as separate objects, rather than one object and shortcuts to that object. This will cause storage to be used disproportionately; 50 GB of mail for a single system could require 125 GB until the migration is complete (50 GB on each system, and duplication of messages in the target system).

2.1 Objectives

The following are the Objectives of Fort Bend County migration:

- Create new Exchange organization in existing AD domain
- Move email infrastructure to Microsoft based technology
- · Migrate existing user e-mail information, rights, calendars, and contacts
- Assist client with setting up outlook for deployment
- · Hold weekly status meeting with the clients staff

Throughout the project Harding Group will maintain consistent communication with the project manager and Fort Bend team.

3 Proposed Implementation Process

3.1 Migration Concept

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In the case of a messaging migration for Fort Bend County, The Harding Group suggests a migration strategy that has been successful and efficient for our Clients in the past, and that is particularly well suited to school districts. We suggest a 'dialtone' migration, rather than a continuous co-existence between directories and mail systems.

Fort Bend County was somewhat unclear as to whether coexistence between mail systems is mandated. While the issue was discussed, in the interest of providing a complete response HGI would like to clarify its proposed method to migrate Fort Bend County from Novell GroupWise to Exchange:

The most complex and costly scenario is the coexistence of both Exchange and Novell GroupWise. Each system is capable of delivering mail for a given DNS name and needs ta know about which system hasts which mailboxes. Special mail routing rules have to be created (and maintained) on each system, as well. Two separate email archives and separate SPAM and virus protection (unless this anti-X solution is hosted in the cloud and is the first hop in inbound mail routing) will have to be maintained as well.

The only compelling case for coexistence involves very large mail organizations that cannot afford to backfill a new mail infrastructure with legacy data.

In contrast to mail system coexistence stands what we call a 'dialtone' migration. In this scenario, a hard switch between mail systems occurs, on a predetermined date, all new inbound mail flows to Exchange rather than Novell GroupWise and Novell GroupWise is prevented from sending mail. Users start with an empty mailbox, but there is a centralized effort to migrate mailbox data from the legacy system. Fort Bend County can decide to migrate all or some users, all or some of their mail messages or folders as well as any part of a Novell GroupWise mailbox (calendar, contacts...)

The advantage of a 'dialtone' approach is that the additional 'connector' servers, and the extensive configuration and troubleshooting time to make the two systems coexist, are no longer needed. This saves fort Bend County considerable time, expense, and exposure to risk. All mailbox items far every user will still be migrated to the new environment. Using this method, the actual migration will occur much more quickly and cleanly.

HGI will be using this approach for a mail system migration.

3.2 Train the Trainer

The Harding Group will conduct a one-day Microsoft Outlook class for Fort Bend County's training staff, to prepare them for their task of training the end-users. This will include training

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accounts, and early access to Exchange, to build the training material necessary. This training would utilize the pre-production Exchange environment

3.3 Exchange

The Harding Group will implement the Exchange infrastructure designed and agreed upon by both parties, in the design phase of the project.

3.4 Migration

The Harding group will require a lab of workstations, to install the migration tools onto and to be used as the migration 'engine'. The migration would occur in two phases. The first will migrate 50 users into a pre-production Exchange environment for testing and familiarity; the second will occur on a predetermined date, and will target the same environment.

4 Design & Implementation

4.1 Phase 1: Design

4.1.1 Objective 1: Exchange Design

HGI will hold a one day whiteboard session with Fort Bend County's principals and staff to determine the optimal configuration of the Exchange infrastructure to be deployed, and discuss the particular needs of Fort Bend County. Such as:

- Anticipated load from Outlook Anywhere, Outlook Web Access (OWA) and mobile (phone) clients
- Anti-SPAM and Anti-Virus solutions
- Site design for distributed systems, including Clustering, Database Access Groups, and Replication
- · Exchange databases and/or individual mailboxes sizes and limits
- Security and Permissions pertaining to Exchange servers and mailboxes
- Addressing policies
- Mail retention needs and compliance mandates
- · Multiple mail domain hosting
- Public Folders or other collaborative systems
- Offline Address Book generation strategies
- · Migration requirements and strategies
- Virtualization options
- Outlook deployment options
- · Knowledge Transfer Requirements
- Backup strategies and Disaster Recovery requirements and options
- Archiving and Retention policies

4.1.2 Exchange Design Document

HGI will present an Exchange design document including:

- · Mail flow diagram
- Complete spec sheet and diagram, for each server involved in the Exchange organization
- Detailed listing of server roles and Exchange databases configurations
- All hardware required for each relevant role (Mailbox, Hub Transport, Client Access, Edge Transport, etc.)
- Detailed description of implementation steps and interaction between services and components
- · Final timeline for implementation steps

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4.2 Phase 2: Implementation

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4.2.1 Objective 1: Exchange Implementation

HGI will implement the Exchange rollout based on the design plan including the following deliverables:

- · Baseline Operating System
- Install Exchange Server software and configure Exchange Roles
- Create and optimize Exchange database(s)
- Configure and optimize Microsoft Web server(s) to provide OWA capability
- Configure SMTP communication both within and outside of the client environment
- Configure Exchange Recipient Policies and Offline Address Book generation
- Configure Anti-Virus and assist client in an Exchange changes necessary for ProofPoint
 appliance
- Mail-enable Active Directory Objects, including users and Distribution Lists (groups)
- Build migration workstation: install Quest tools on workstations
- Migrate up to 50 test mailboxes, including calendars and contacts, using industrystandard tools and practices
- · Verify all test users' connectivity to required resources

4.3 Phase 3: Migration

Once the new infrastructure is in place, HGI will assist Fort Bend County with the migration of data as follows:

4.3.1 Objective 1: Outlook Deployment Configuration

 Assist client with creating an Outlook installation to push to computers in their environment via SCCM, other third party application push technologies, or manual installation

4.3.2 Objective 2: Mail Migration

- Cutover production to Exchange 2010 mail infrastructure
- Verifying import status of mailbox data and remediate as needed
- Migrate production mailboxes (including resource mailboxes), including calendars, distribution lists, proxy/share information and contacts, using industry-standard tools and practices
- Migrate users GroupWise archives to the Exchange environment or PST files from a central location

Upon completion of this objective, Fort Bend County will be provided with 'as-built' configuration documentation for the server environment.



4.4 Phase 4 (Optional): Blackberry Migration

- HGI will implement a new BES server into the Exchange environment including:
 - 3 Baseline operating system installation
 - **○** BES software installation
 - BES service account creation
 - BES Exchange permission creation
 - c BES Exchange throttling policy creation
 - n Testing up to 10 phones with the new BES server

4.5 Phase 5: Knowledge Transfer and Documentation

- Deliver the final design documents, updated with all changes approved during Phases 2 and 3, that reflect the Client's final, production infrastructure, to the client
- Remain available to key Client staff to answer questions, either relating to final deliverables, or ongoing maintenance of the new environment
- Knowledge transfer and training of key Client staff on Exchange operations, such as mail-enabling objects (i.e. create a mail account), purging of disabled or orphaned mailboxes, and troubleshooting mail flow

 - An example is if Fort Bend County has 2000 users with 500MB quotas they would need roughly 3.0-3.5 TBs available for mail data, an addition 1.0 TB available for log storage depending on their backup mechanism, plus archiving space.
- Fort Bend County will provide HGI with remote connectivity to monitor migration.
- Fort Bend County has approximately 2000 Exchange mailboxes
- Any archives to be migrated will be moved to a central (server) location prior to migration
- Fort Bend County will provide a spreadsheet cross-referencing GroupWise email account names to Active Directory account names and desired SMTP addresses if different from original

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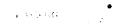

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13 Contractual Agreement
