AGREEMENT FOR MULTIMEDIA AND AUDIOVISUAL SYSTEM DESIGN AND INSTALLATION SERVICES FOR FORT BEND COUNTY JUSTICE CENTER

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between Fort Bend County, (hereinafter "County"), a body corporate and politic under the laws of the State of Texas, and Troxell Communications, Inc., (hereinafter "Contractor"), a corporation authorized to conduct business in the State of Texas.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, County desires that Contractor provide multimedia and audiovisual system design and installation services related to the Fort Bend County Justice Center (hereinafter "Services"), pursuant to RFP 11-037; and

WHEREAS, Contractor represents that it is qualified and desires to perform such services.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions set forth below, the parties agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

Article I. Scope of Services

Contractor shall render Services to County as defined in the Scope of Services (attached hereto as Exhibit A).

Article II. Personnel

- 2.1 Contractor represents that it presently has, or is able to obtain, adequate qualified personnel in its employment for the timely performance of the Scope of Services required under this Agreement and that Contractor shall furnish and maintain, at its own expense, adequate and sufficient personnel, in the opinion of County, to perform the Scope of Services when and as required and without delays.
- 2.2 All employees of Contractor shall have such knowledge and experience as will enable them to perform the duties assigned to them. Any employee of Contractor who, in the opinion of County, is incompetent or by his conduct becomes detrimental to the project shall, upon request of County, immediately be removed from association with the project.

Article III. Compensation and Payment

- 3.1 Contractor's fees shall be calculated at the rates set forth in the attached Exhibit A. The Maximum Compensation for the performance of Services within the Scope of Services described in Exhibit A is one million fifteen thousand five hundred and fifty dollars and 46/100 (\$1,015,550.46). In no case shall the amount paid under this Agreement exceed the Maximum Compensation without an approved change order.
- 3.2 All performance of the Scope of Services including any changes in the Scope of Services and revision of work satisfactorily performed will be performed only when approved in advance and authorized by County. Payment will be made in accordance with those payment procedures set forth in Section 3.3 below.
- 3.3 It is understood and agreed that payments will be made to Contractor by County based on the following procedures: Contractor shall submit invoices to County showing the amounts due for materials and labor as set forth in the attached Exhibit A. County shall review such invoices and approve them within 30 calendar days with such modifications as are consistent with this Agreement and forward same to the Auditor for processing. County shall pay each such approved invoice within thirty (30) calendar days of receipt. County reserves the right to withhold payment pending verification of satisfactory work performed.
- 3.4 County is a body corporate and politic under the laws of the State of Texas and claims exemption from sales and use taxes.

Article IV. Limit of Appropriation

- 4.1 Prior to execution of this Agreement, Contractor has been advised by County, and Contractor clearly understands and agrees, such understanding and agreement being of the absolute essence of this Agreement, that County shall have available the total maximum sum of one million fifteen thousand five hundred and fifty dollars and 46/100 (\$1,015,550.46), specifically allocated to fully discharge any and all liabilities which may be incurred by County.
- 4.2 Contractor does further understand and agree, said understanding and agreement also being of the absolute essence of this Agreement, that the total maximum compensation that Contractor may become entitled to hereunder and the total maximum sum that County shall become liable to pay to Contractor hereunder shall not under any conditions, circumstances, or interpretations thereof exceed one million fifteen thousand five hundred and fifty dollars and 46/100 (\$1,015,550.46).

Article V. Time of Performance

It is understood and agreed that the time for performance of the Scope of Services under this Agreement shall begin with receipt of the Notice to Proceed and end no later than July 4, 2011. Tasks described in the Scope of Services shall be completed within this time or within such additional time as may be extended by the County.

Article VI. Modifications

Any modifications to this Agreement must be in writing and must be signed by both parties.

Article VII. Termination

7.1 Termination for Convenience

7.1.1 County may terminate this Agreement at any time upon fifteen (15) days written notice.

7.2 Termination for Default

- 7.2.1 County may terminate the whole or any part of this Agreement for cause in the following circumstances:
- 7.2.1.1 If Contractor fails to perform services within the time specified in the Scope of Services or any extension thereof granted by the County in writing;
- 7.2.1.2 If Contractor materially breaches any of the covenants or terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement or fails to perform any of the other provisions of this Agreement or so fails to make progress as to endanger performance of this Agreement in accordance with its terms, and in any of these circumstances does not cure such breach or failure to County's reasonable satisfaction within a period of ten (10) calendar days after receipt of notice from County specifying such breach or failure.
- 7.2.2 If, after termination, it is determined for any reason whatsoever that Contractor was not in default, or that the default was excusable, the rights and obligations of the parties shall be the same as if the termination had been issued for the convenience of the County in accordance with Section 6.1 above.
- 7.3 Upon termination of this Agreement, County shall compensate Contractor in accordance with Section 3, above, for those services which were provided under this Agreement prior to its termination and which have not been previously invoiced to County. Contractor's final invoice for said services will be presented to and paid by County in the same manner set forth in Section 3 above.
- 7.4 If County terminates this Agreement as provided in this Section, no fees of any type, other than fees due and payable at the Termination Date, shall thereafter be paid to Contractor.

Article VIII. Ownership and Reuse of Documents

All documents, data, reports, research, graphic presentation materials, etc., developed by Contractor as a part of its work under this Agreement, shall become the property of County

upon completion of this Agreement, or in the event of termination or cancellation thereof, at the time of payment under Section 3 for work performed. All such data and material shall be promptly furnished to County on request.

Article IX. Inspection of Books and Records

Contractor will permit County, or any duly authorized agent of County, to inspect and examine the books and records of Contractor for the purpose of verifying the amount of work performed under the Scope of Services. County's right to inspect survives the termination of this Agreement for a period of four years.

Article X. Insurance

- 10.1 Prior to commencement of the Services, Contractor shall furnish County with properly executed certificates of insurance which shall evidence all insurance required and provide that such insurance shall not be canceled, except on 30 days' prior written notice to County. Contractor shall provide certified copies of insurance endorsements and/or policies if requested by County. Contractor shall maintain such insurance coverage from the time Services commence until Services are completed and provide replacement certificates, policies and/or endorsements for any such insurance expiring prior to completion of Services. Contractor shall obtain such insurance written on an Occurrence form from such companies having Bests rating of A/VII or better, licensed or approved to transact business in the State of Texas, and shall obtain such insurance of the following types and minimum limits:
- 10.1.1 Workers' Compensation insurance in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. Substitutes to genuine Workers' Compensation Insurance will not be allowed. Employers' Liability insurance with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per injury by accident, \$1,000,000 per injury by disease, and \$1,000,000 per bodily injury by disease.
- 10.1.2 Commercial general liability insurance with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence and \$2,000,000 in the annual aggregate. Policy shall cover liability for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage and products/completed operations arising out of the business operations of the policyholder.
- 10.1.3 Business Automobile Liability insurance with a combined Bodily Injury/Property Damage limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each accident. The policy shall cover liability arising from the operation of licensed vehicles by policyholder.
 - 10.1.4 Professional Liability insurance with limits not less than \$1,000,000.
- 10.2 County and the members of Commissioners Court shall be named as additional insured to all required coverage except for **Workers'** Compensation. All Liability policies written on behalf of Contractor shall contain a waiver of subrogation in favor of County and members of Commissioners Court.

10.3 If required coverage is written on a claims-made basis, Contractor warrants that any retroactive date applicable to coverage under the policy precedes the effective date of the contract; and that continuous coverage will be maintained or an extended discovery period will be exercised for a period of 2 years beginning from the time that work under the Agreement is completed.

Article XI. Performance and Payment Bonds

Contractor shall post with County, not later than ten (10) days after execution of this Agreement, a performance and payment bond in the amount of one hundred percent (100%) of the total lump sum price in such form as is satisfactory by County. This bond shall be executed by a corporate surety company duly authorized and admitted to do business in the State of Texas and licensed to issue such a bond in the State of Texas. Contractor shall notify its corporate surety of any contract changes.

Article XII. Indemnity

CONTRACTOR SHALL SAVE HARMLESS COUNTY FROM AND AGAINST ALL CLAIMS, LIABILITY, AND EXPENSES, INCLUDING REASONABLE ATTORNEYS FEES, ARISING FROM ACTIVITIES OF CONTRACTOR, ITS AGENTS, SERVANTS OR EMPLOYEES, PERFORMED UNDER THIS AGREEMENT THAT RESULT FROM THE NEGLIGENT ACT, ERROR, OR OMISSION OF CONTRACTOR OR ANY OF CONTRACTOR'S AGENTS, SERVANTS OR EMPLOYEES.

Article XIII. Confidential and Proprietary Information

- 13.1 Contractor acknowledges that it and its employees or agents may, in the course of performing their responsibilities under this Agreement, be exposed to or acquire information that is confidential to County. Any and all information of any form obtained by Contractor or its employees or agents in the performance of this Agreement shall be deemed to be confidential information of County ("Confidential Information"). Any reports or other documents or items (including software) that result from the use of the Confidential Information by Contractor shall be treated with respect to confidentiality in the same manner as the Confidential Information. Confidential Information shall be deemed not to include information that (a) is or becomes (other than by disclosure by Contractor) publicly known or is contained in a publicly available document; (b) is furnished by County to others without restrictions similar to those imposed by this Agreement; (c) is rightfully in Contractor's possession without the obligation of nondisclosure prior to the time of its disclosure under this Agreement; or (d) is independently developed by employees or agents of Contractor who can be shown to have had no access to the Confidential Information.
- 13.2 Contractor agrees to hold Confidential Information in strict confidence, using at least the same degree of care that Contractor uses in maintaining the confidentiality of its own confidential information, and not to copy, reproduce, sell, assign, license, market, transfer or otherwise dispose of, give, or disclose Confidential Information to third parties or use Confidential Information for any purposes whatsoever other than the provision of

Services to County hereunder, and to advise each of its employees and agents of their obligations to keep Confidential Information confidential. Contractor shall use its best efforts to assist County in identifying and preventing any unauthorized use or disclosure of any Confidential Information. Without limitation of the foregoing, Contractor shall advise County immediately in the event Contractor learns or has reason to believe that any person who has had access to Confidential Information has violated or intends to violate the terms of this Agreement and Contractor will at its expense cooperate with County in seeking injunctive or other equitable relief in the name of County or Contractor against any such person. Contractor agrees that, except as directed by County, Contractor will not at any time during or after the term of this Agreement disclose, directly or indirectly, any Confidential Information to any person, and that upon termination of this Agreement or at County's request, Contractor will turn over to County all documents, papers, and other matter in Contractor's possession which embody Confidential Information.

- 13.3 Contractor acknowledges that a breach of this Section, including disclosure of any Confidential Information, or disclosure of other information that, at law or in equity, ought to remain confidential, will give rise to irreparable injury to County that is inadequately compensable in damages. Accordingly, County may seek and obtain injunctive relief against the breach or threatened breach of the foregoing undertakings, in addition to any other legal remedies that may be available. Contractor acknowledges and agrees that the covenants contained herein are necessary for the protection of the legitimate business interest of County and are reasonable in scope and content.
- 13.4 Contractor in providing all services hereunder agrees to abide by the provisions of any applicable Federal or State Data Privacy Act.

Article XIV. Independent Contractor

- 14.1 In the performance of work or services hereunder, Contractor shall be deemed an independent contractor, and any of its agents, employees, officers, or volunteers performing work required hereunder shall be deemed solely as employees of contractor or, where permitted, of its subcontractors.
- 14.2 Contractor and its agents, employees, officers, or volunteers shall not, by performing work pursuant to this Agreement, be deemed to be employees, agents, or servants of County and shall not be entitled to any of the privileges or benefits of County employment.

Article XV. Contract Administration

15.1 All written notices, demands, and other papers or documents to be delivered to County under this Agreement shall be delivered to the Fort Bend County Facilities Management and Planning Department, 1517 Eugene Heimann Circle, Suite 500, Richmond, Texas 77469, or at such other place or places as it may from time to time designate by written notice delivered to Contractor. For purposes of notice under this Agreement, a copy of any notice or

communication hereunder shall also be forwarded to the following address: Fort Bend County, 301 Jackson Street, Suite 719, Richmond, Texas 77469, Attention: County Judge.

15.2 All written notices, demands, and other papers or documents to be delivered to Contractor under this Agreement shall be delivered to Troxell Communications, Inc., 14019 Southwest Freeway, Suite 301, Sugar Land, Texas 77478, or such other place or places as Contractor may designate by written notice delivered to County.

Article XVI. Compliance with Laws

Contractor shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws, statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations, and the orders and decrees of any courts or administrative bodies or tribunals in any matter affecting the performance of this Agreement, including, without limitation, Worker's Compensation laws, minimum and maximum salary and wage statutes and regulations, licensing laws and regulations. When required, Contractor shall furnish County with certification of compliance with said laws, statutes, ordinances, rules, regulations, orders, and decrees above specified.

Article XVII. Performance Warranty

- 17.1 Contractor warrants to County that Contractor has the skill and knowledge ordinarily possessed by well-informed members of its trade or profession practicing in the greater Houston metropolitan area and Contractor will apply that skill and knowledge with care and diligence to ensure that the Services provided hereunder will be performed and delivered in accordance with the highest professional standards.
- 17.2 Contractor warrants to County that the Services will be free from material errors and will materially conform to all requirements and specifications contained in the attached Exhibit A.

Article XVIII. Assignment

Neither party may assign or transfer its rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party.

Article XIX. Applicable Law

This Agreement shall be construed under and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. The parties hereto acknowledge that venue is proper in Fort Bend County, Texas, for all disputes arising hereunder and waive the right to sue or be sued elsewhere.

Article XX. Successors and Assigns

County and Contractor bind themselves and their successors, executors, administrators and assigns to the other party of this Agreement and to the successors, executors, administrators and assigns of the other party, in respect to all covenants of this Agreement.

Article XXI. Publicity

Contact with citizens of Fort Bend County, media outlets, or governmental agencies shall be the sole responsibility of County. Under no circumstances whatsoever, shall Contractor release any material or information developed or received in the performance of the Services hereunder without the express written permission of County, except where required to do so by law.

Article XXII. Conflict

Terms and Conditions

Hours of Operations

Unless otherwise noted in the Scope of Work, Monday through Friday, 7:00 am to 5:00 pm are considered normal working times. All hours oustide these times, including weekends and holidays, will be considered "premium" billable hours at 1 1/2 times the hourly rate unless otherwise noted in this Scope of Work. Working days and hours need to be established in the quoting process only.

Accessibility

Unless otherwise noted in the Scope of Work, free and clear access to all areas requiring installation and/or servicing of products will be made available by the customer within the timeframes agreed on. Delays or rescheduling caused by accessibility or availability and not caused by Troxell Communications, Inc., will be subject to additional charges.

Electrical Work

Troxell Communications, Inc. is not a licensed High Voltage contractor. All electrical work required for the proper operation of the A/V equipment supplied and installed by Troxell will be the responsibility of others. This includes but is not limited to: power outlets, power circuits, lightin circuits, conduits, raceways and ladder racks. Troxell will not be responsible for unsatisfactory (new or existing) electrical power conditions that affect the performance of the equipment such as noise or grounding issues. Troxell will provide surface mounted wiremold for low voltage wiring (if needed) and only if listed on the original quote of Scope of Work as a billable line item. Change orders/Scope of Work Change Requests will need to be made if walls and and ceilings are found to be impassable and require the use of wiremold or like products. Troxell may subcontract electrical work if desired by customer.

Equipment Storage/Delivery

All A/V equipment delivered, stored or staged at the customer's site before or during the installation becomes the property and responsibility of the client. Troxell will assume no liability of lost or stolen equipment or supplies after it reaches the customers site. Troxell technicians will require a delivery sign-off at the time of delivery. Troxell technicians will remove all tools and Troxell property at the conclusion of each day.

Installation Completion Sign-off

Unless otherwise noted in the Scope of Work, Troxell installation personnel will present a job sign-off form after the equipment is installed, tested and user training (if included) has been completed. This form must be signed by an individual, previously noted in this Scope of Work, having the authority to release or authorize payment for services and products supplied by Troxell Communications, Inc.

Keys/Alarms Codes

Troxell Communications, Inc. requests that an employee or designated representative be available to allow for access to all locked and/or alarmed areas. Troxell Communications will provide an *Access to Premises Agreement* form that will need to be signed before troxell technicians accept keys or alarm codes. This form releases Troxell Communications from liability and costs associated with the loss of the key. It the client chooses not to sign the agreement, they will need to provide access when needed.

Mill Work

Troxell does not offer custom mill work or cutting of client owned furniture. If this is needed for equipment supplied by Troxell, the sizes and dimensions will be requested from the equipment manufacturer and delivered by Troxell Communications. The client will be responsible for this work.



Point of Contact

Troxell Communications, Inc. prefers to communicate with a single point of contact that is responsible for the entire project described in this Scope of Work. This contact should be listed as contact name 1 in the Acceptance section of this Scope of Work. This person should be available to answer questions, concerns and/or be able to authorize or permit changes throughout the project. Any other names provided by the client in the Acceptance section of this document will be contacted only after failed attempts to reach contact name 1.

Safety & Health


