

**#5 - We have the ability to provide full enforcement within Fort Bend County.**

**#6 - The Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office received the Comptroller's Tobacco Compliance Grant for a number of years and always performed well above 100% in our tobacco prevention efforts. Our goal is to conduct controlled buys on 200% of the permitted retail outlets in our county. We have the determination to continue our ultimate goal of limiting minors' access to tobacco, and based on our experience, we know the retailer plays a huge role in that goal. It's very simple. If the retailers don't sell, the minors won't have access. By making continued visits to the outlets and letting retailers know we are serious about tobacco sales to minors, we hope to keep the buy rate in Fort Bend County low. From September 2, 2013 until April 25, 2014 we have conducted a total of 614 controlled buy attempts with 20 sales which is**

**a 3.26% buy rate. Our plan is to conduct controlled buys on all tobacco permitted retailers in our county where minors have access and to make follow-up controlled buys on outlets that sell to minors as well as make buy attempts on those outlets that have a history of selling tobacco to minors.**
