Moreover, Fort Bend County was recently awarded the Texas Comptroller Leadership Circle "Gold" Award for the fifth year in a row for displaying a high standard of financial transparency online.

Fort Bend County Public Transportation's Finance/Administration Manager and Grants/Budget Manager will provide immediate oversight and direction over the grant's administration. Offices of the County Auditor and County Attorney, along with the Treasurer, Purchasing, Risk Management, Legal, and Human Resources departments provide these necessary functions for the Transportation department.

Please give a brief executive summary of program/project. Fort Bend County will establish three point deviation transportation routes to specifically serve the Richmond/Rosenberg areas. These routes will provide access to key points of interest within the Richmond/Rosenberg for job opportunities, medical, grocery and social service needs.

What is the specific problem, challenge or need to be addressed? (Two sentences) At present time, there is a lack of sufficient transportation services to meet the needs of the Richmond/Rosenberg community. This is supported by the fact that system-wide, Fort Bend County Public Transportation has an average of 150 trip denials per day, and Richmond and Rosenberg alone generate approximately 40% of our total in-County trips.

USING QUANTITATIVE MEASURES, list the major goals of the program/project.

The major goals of this project are to A) reduce our overall number of trip denials (quantifiable data), by B) providing more overall service to the area (measured by total ridership).

Provide specific steps or activities critical to achieving the desired goals, including (1) how much, (2) how often, and (3) how long activities/services will be provided?

As mentioned, Fort Bend County will establish three point-deviation transportation routes in the Richmond/Rosenberg area. This will involve operating three buses an average of 11.5 hours a day, Monday through Friday.

What facilities, staffing and/or collaborations will be required? Fort Bend County currently has the infrastructure needed to establish and maintain operation of the services through use of County facilities and staffing in conjunction with our third-party contractor, who directly operates the service. On a fiscal level, along with this application, Fort Bend County is collaborating with the City of Richmond and the City of Rosenberg for long term financial support of these services.

What results are expected from the above listed activities? Expected results include reduction in the total number of trip denials and increased ridership in the Richmond/Rosenberg areas.

What quantitative data will be collected to describe the intended outcomes of the program/project? Include total number to be served (unduplicated if possible) and specific demographics, i.e., socio-economic status, gender, ethnicity, age ranges, etc. of targeted populations.

Fort Bend County Public Transportation will track ridership levels over the course of the three year project. Ridership is tracked by recording the total number of unlinked passenger trips performed without regard to passenger demographics. In addition, Fort Bend County will continue to track trip denials and compare that information to historical data in order to track progress in this area.

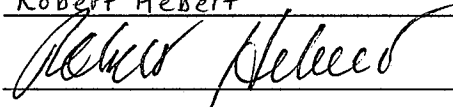
