BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEASLEY, TEXAS:


Section 1: The City Council hereby consents to the creation of the District as requested.



BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROSENBERG:

Section 1. The City of Rosenberg has been served with a petition for a proposed Emergency Services District, named Fort Bend County Emergency Services District No. 8, herein after referred to as "District" on November 6, 2014.


Section 2. That the boundaries of the proposed District includes portions of the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Rosenberg.
