Mr. Roy Cordes, County Attorney stated the County is upholding the traditional budget responsibilities and laws of Commissioners Court and also the equity and rulings of what has existed in the past by District Court in their administrative oversight as it has been exercised over the last 90 years in Texas. The court is not weighing into the litigation of Galveston County.

After much discussion between the members of Commissioners Court and the County Attorney, Judge Hebert stated Fort Bend County Commissioners Court does not have a position on Cause No 15CV0583 in the Galveston County court; but this case is mentioned in the Resolution and is being considered where issues are being brought up. The court does want to weigh in strongly in supporting the continued separation of powers and recognition of the right of District courts to have an administrative oversight.
