


WHAT IS TX-PACE?

- Local adoption economic development tool property assessment
- > 100% long term, low cost private financing
- For energy efficiency, water conservation, distributed generation, and demand reduction (resiliency)
- On commercial, industrial, and multifamily (5+ units) properties
- PACE in a Box model program collaboration of 130 volunteers over 1.5 years, state-wide uniform best practices, local economic and environmental benefits for Fort Bend County

The Fort Bend PACE Program

- Fort Bend County established program in November 2015; program live May 2016
- Texas PACE Authority selected to administer the program at no cost to the County
- Public Service Model
 - Approves projects on an objective, transparent basis using state-wide best practices for underwriting and technical standards
 - Education, outreach and training
 - Funded by user fees and foundation grants



Investment in Texas: 700% increase


Statewide Year to year (2016-2017)




