IN SUPPORT OF

ADDITIONAL TRAINING FOR THE PREVENTION OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING SECURING FUNDING TOWARDS MORE TRAINING FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT, PROSECUTORS AND SCHOOL TEACHERS/ADMINISTRATORS
