

RESOLUTION REGULATING ROADSIDE VENDORS

WHEREAS, The operation of roadside vending can result in personal injury or property damage or negatively affect the area in which it is conducted; and

WHEREAS, Roadside vending generates unwanted and unhealthy waste including waste water; and

WHEREAS, The sale of food, of any description, without proper inspections could cause illness and health and safety concerns; and

WHEREAS, Roadside vending creates traffic problems or increases an existing traffic problems and creates pedestrian/vehicle safety issues; and

WHEREAS, The operation of roadside vending can detrimentally affect the amenity of the neighborhoods and the surrounding area; and


WHEREAS, H.B. 1814 allows Fort Bend County to be included in the list of counties that have the authority to prohibit roadside vending of any kind in unincorporated areas of the county.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF FORT BEND COUNTY, TEXAS:


