**ORDER ESTABLISHING AND ORGANIZING  
FORT BEND COUNTY ASSISTANCE DISTRICT NO. 21**

RECITALS

WHEREAS, on May 4, 2019, Fort Bend County (the "County") held an election for the creation of Fort Bend County Assistance District No. 21 (the "District") and the imposition of a sales and use tax at the rate of two percent within the boundaries of the District; and

WHEREAS, the County certified the results of the election on May 14, 2019, in which the voters authorized the creation of the District and the imposition of a sales and use tax at the rate of two percent within the boundaries of the District; and

WHEREAS, the County notified the City of Kendleton, a municipality with portions of its territory within the boundaries of the District, of its intent to create the District as an opportunity to exclude the municipal territory from the District not later than the 60<sup>th</sup> day before the County ordered the election, pursuant to Section 387.003 (b-1) of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the City of Kendleton did not send notice of its desire to exclude its municipal territory from the District to the County within forty-five (45) days of receipt of the County's notice of intent to create the District; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to establish the District and organize its operations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF FORT BEND COUNTY THAT:

Section 1: The District is established and is authorized to impose a sales and use tax at the rate of two percent within the boundaries of the District, commencing on the first day of the first calendar quarter occurring after the expiration of the first complete quarter occurring after the date the State Comptroller receives a copy of the order imposing the sales and use tax adopted by the District's governing body, anticipated to be October 1, 2019.

Section 2: The Commissioners Court hereby authorizes the officers and employees of the County to notify the State Comptroller of the creation of the District and the authorization to impose a sales and use tax at the rate of two percent within the boundaries of the District.

Section 3: The Commissioners Court shall serve as the initial Board of Directors of the District, but reserves the right pursuant to Section 387.005 of the Texas Local Government Code to appoint a separate governing body of the district.


Section 4: This Order is effective immediately upon passage.
