

FORT BEND COUNTY RESOLUTION
IN SUPPORT OF
WITHDRAWING THE VETO ON HB 1120

WHEREAS, HB 1120 would have allowed County Assistance Districts to provide a more efficient use of taxpayer dollars by supporting the provision of vital services that benefit the public; and

WHEREAS, said services would include, but not limited to, the increase of law enforcement who working in conjunction with other governmental activity would better serve the district; and

WHEREAS, having already passed in the House and Chamber with an extensive majority, it is made presumably clear that the State sees this as a benefit for the taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, the County believes it in the interest of the taxpayer to promote an increase in the provision of benefits and services while simultaneously limiting imposed taxes; and

WHEREAS, Commissioner's Court, acting as the Board of Directors of the County Assistance Districts, must vote on all expenditures of the districts, therefore acting as a safeguard against abuse, as it does with authorizing expenditures of property taxes; and


WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Fort Bend County, Texas, finds that this resolution serves a public purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Fort Bend County Commissioners Court requests Governor Abbott withdraw the veto on HB 1120.





Commissioner Grady Prestage, Pct. 2



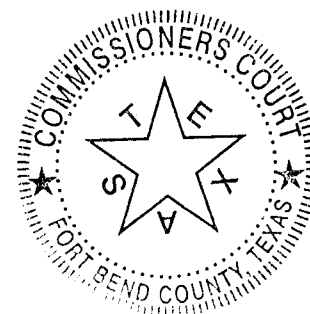

FORT BEND COUNTY RESOLUTION
IN SUPPORT OF
WITHDRAWING THE VETO ON HB 1174

WHEREAS, HB 1174 supports County Assistance Districts' ability to both accept and make a grant or loan, in contrast to current legislation which only allows for the acceptance of loans; and

WHEREAS, It seeks to grant this authority as it will increase efficiency in spending, lower property taxes, and can help fund projects for the benefit of multiple political subdivisions; and


WHEREAS, such legislation would serve in the interest of the community with aims to help keep government small and reduce the reliance on county property taxes; and

WHEREAS, Fort Bend County Commissioner's Court, acting as the Board of Directors of the County Assistance Districts, must vote on all expenditures of property taxes, therefore acting as a safeguard against abuse, as it does with authorizing expenditures on property taxes ; and


WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Fort Bend County, Texas, finds that this resolution serves a public purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Fort Bend County Commissioners Court requests Governor Abbott withdraw the veto on HB 1174.





Commissioner Grady Prestage, Pct. 2


