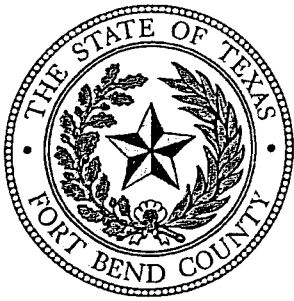


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Good afternoon Judge and Commissioners. Thank you for allowing me to speak on Agenda Item 25B.

My name is Andre McDonald. I live at 4010 Lyndhurst Place Sugar Land, Texas Precinct 4.

I'm here this afternoon to express I'm in favor of item 25B 5, setting up a separate dispatch unit.

And opposition to adding item 25B's 1, 2, 3, and 4 to the 2019-20 Budget.

The proposed 2019-20 Budget is a 6% increase over this year's Budget and I believe that increasing the proposed Budget even more is not being fiscally responsible. Again, I request you not add these additional expenses to taxpayers, we are taxed enough already.

Although it is not known at this point if the Flood Mitigation Bond Referendum will have any impact on the upcoming or future Budgets, there are important issues to consider. The overwhelming many of us are already paying a tax for flood mitigation to a special district or to a city in addition to what we pay to the county and to the county drainage district.

My wife and I are paying taxes for flood mitigation to Sugar Land and FBCLID 2. I'm on the board of LID 2. In May, we passed an \$88 million flood mitigation bond referendum and in June we sold \$48 million in bonds to responsibly address flooding in our district and at this point, the county will not be paying any portion of LID 2's debt.

A significant portion of the county's flood mitigation funding is for areas that are not in a flood mitigation district or a city, as

most occupied areas are. Further, Representative Zerwas introduced legislation in 2019 to allow for the creation of flood mitigation districts for these areas but pulled the legislation after strenuous objections from the residents in these areas, who objected to paying a tax for their own flood mitigation. I am certainly willing to help my fellow residents help themselves, but it is unfair to ask the taxpayers, who are already paying an additional flood mitigation tax, to pay for flood mitigation for property owners who refuse to pay for their own. Soon homeowners in LID 2 will be paying about \$700 in LID (maybe as much as 19 cents) taxes annually, while the taxpayers in the areas not in a flood mitigation district pay nothing. How about the rest of the county help pay our \$88 million.

Whether or not I vote for the county's Bond Referendum depends on whether or not this Commissioners Court fairly and

equably protects the majority of us taxpayers from potential abuse.
