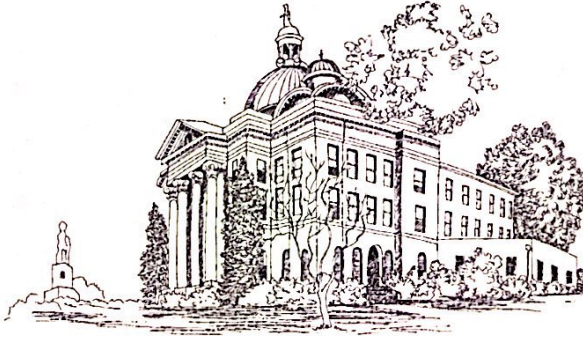


Proclamation




