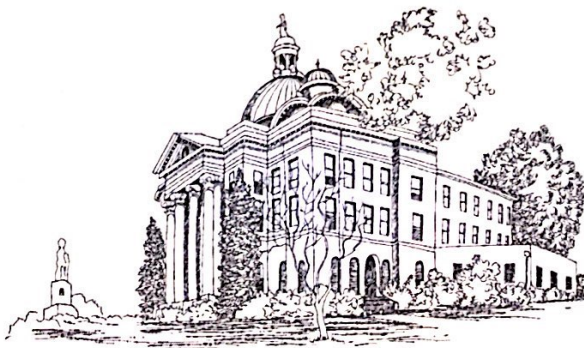


Proclamation



- WHEREAS,** Fort Bend County remembers Ms. Viola Randle and her lifelong passion for serving her community. Ms. Randle was the Mayor of Fulshear, Texas, from 1993 to 1998. She was born on July 26, 1924 and passed away on September 16, 2020 at the age of 96.
- WHEREAS,** Ms. Randle grew up on a farm surrounded by friends and family, and dedicated herself to bettering the lives of others in her hometown through civic and community engagement.
- WHEREAS,** Ms. Randle served the City of Fulshear as mayor from 1993 to 1998 and continued to donate her time and mentorship through her final days by serving on the Board of the Fulshear Historic Commission and volunteering for community nonprofits and the Greater Zachary Baptist Church.
- WHEREAS,** Ms. Viola Randle and a team of civically minded individuals led the initial incorporation of the City of Fulshear. After incorporation, Ms. Randle ran for City Council and became the first Black woman elected to Fulshear City Council where she served for ten years. Then, she successfully ran for mayor, and became the first African-American to serve as the Mayor of Fulshear. As mayor, she directed the beginning of the city's transformation from a rural community of 600 into the bustling suburban community of over 12,000 residents that it is today.
- WHEREAS,** From passing ordinances to keep Fulshear's streets and water clean, establishing community centers and safe playgrounds for children, to protecting the status of the Fulshear Black Cemetery, Ms. Randle's legacy will be felt by generations of Fulshear residents.
- WHEREAS,** Ms. Viola Randle's life and memory is an inspiration to all of Fort Bend County, and we shall remember her and strive to emulate her care and generosity.
- NOW, THEREFORE,** The Commissioners Court of Fort Bend County, Texas hereby proclaims July 26, 2020, as






