

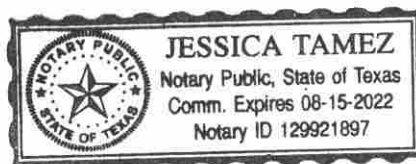

Entries sought for libraries' photo contest - Bridging Differences

Fort Bend County Libraries (FBCL), in conjunction with the Fort Bend County Diversity Initiative, is seeking entries for its "Bridging Differences" Photography Contest. Amateur photographers of all skill levels are invited to enter original photographs that portray the culture, nature, people, and places of Fort Bend County that demonstrate anti-racism and coming together as a community. To be eligible for competition, contestants must submit a digital copy of their photograph between Dec 11 and Jan 11. Entries should be submitted through an online form that will become available on the FBCL website on December 11.

Prizes will be awarded for 1st-place (\$200 gift card), 2nd-place (\$150 gift card), and 3rd-place (\$100 gift card). Winners will be announced on Monday, February 1. Photos will be displayed in a virtual gallery on FBCL's website throughout the month of February. Winning photographs will be determined by a panel of judges, who will make their determinations based on the following criteria: relationship to contest theme, composition, focus, lighting, emotional impact, and creativity. Photographs will be anonymous until after the judging is complete. All entries must be original, unpublished, and the work of the person submitting it. Only one photo may be entered per person. The photo can be in color or black-and-white and should be submitted as a high-resolution (1 MB or higher) .jpg, .jpeg, or gif. Digital manipulations of the photos should be limited to cropping, re-sizing, red-eye reduction, and reasonable adjustments to color and contrast. FBCL reserves the right to print or display any entry in this contest for an indefinite period of time. Entries will be exhibited online for the general public to see, so they should be appropriate for all ages to view.

The photographer is responsible for obtaining verbal or written release for public use of the photo from all identifiable individuals in the photograph submitted; the photographer accepts all liability from the use of a photo where this release has not been obtained. The contest is open to amateur photographers only. Professional photographers who earn a living by selling their photographs, are not eligible to participate. AUTOMOBILE: Chevrolet Tahoe

The 2021 Chevrolet Tahoe is a premier 4-wheel drive vehicle that comes in jet black and maple sugar and has a 10-speed auto transmission. Performance includes the suspension and magnetic ride control, mechanical limited slip differential, two speed transfer case, automatic stop start engine, 20" polished aluminum wheels, stabiltrak, electronic precision hill descent control and trailering equipment. Fuel economy comes in at 18 mpg. Drivers spend 16 in city driving and 20 on the highway. Fuel costs over five years will run \$3,750 compared to the average new vehicle that will cost \$2,250 annually in fuel. Connectivity and technology include 10 speaker Bose audio system, Chevy infotainment system, wireless charging system, open lock and start, and 4Motion performance. Interior and exterior include LED headlamps and taillights, daytime running lamps, hands free power liftgate, power fold mirrors, and dual exhausts.



The interior of the Tahoe keeps you safe with lane departure warning, lane change alert with side blind zone alert, front and rear park assist, rear cross traffic park assist, front pedestrian braking, safety alert seat, and theft deterrent system. The standard vehicle price on the Tahoe is \$65,600. With a premium package the price goes to \$70,085. The options include a sunroof with power panorama, tilt

with power sunshade, cruise control, automatic emergency braking, rear pedestrian alert, rear camera mirror, multi-color head up display, HD surround vision, trailer brake controller, trailering system, trailer side blind zone alert and enhanced cooling fan/driver.

The 2021 Tahoe Chevrolet is an extremely comfortable vehicle that has plenty of space.
