4. Public Comments regarding the Agenda and Announcements.

Judge George expressed his appreciation during the emergency weather event last week to the Fort Bend County Team who worked efficiently and effectively around the clock to serve the residents of Fort Bend County.

Mark Flathouse, Emergency Manager/Fire Marshal stated during the last 7 - 8 days, the EOC has been activated in preparation during this unprecedented weather and they have worked diligently to communicate with our jurisdictions. Information for assistance to help people who were affected by this weather event can be found at www.fbcoem.org. There are different links being updated with different resources daily.

Judge George stated the number of COVID related deaths has surpassed half a million. Thoughts and prayers are with the families who have lost loved ones to this disease and a moment of silence was observed to respect and honor those who lost their lives. The distribution of the COVID vaccine was halted last week, due to the inclement weather and has now restarted.

Dr. Jacquelyn Minter, Director of Health and Human Services indicated there are 49,805 positive COVID cases in Fort Bend County and 492 deaths that have been posted. The County is experiencing the expected decrease in COVID cases and test positivity since our peak in late January. Hospitalizations are also decreasing and death reporting may peak this week and trend downward. This trend exists throughout the Houston Region and with the push for vaccination, the cooperation from the public, and with the increased evidence that vaccinations decrease transmission, it is expected these trends will continue. The County has approached 40,000 vaccines given just through Fort Bend County. Over 100,000 vaccines have been given, in the County along with other partners, private partners, hospitals and others. First doses of the vaccine will be given in our location that will open in Precinct 3, the Katy area and second doses are being given out in other areas of the County this week. Dr. Minter pointed out the UT School of Public Health has let the County know where some of the high prevalence areas are and the high need areas are and the County has matched up each one of the vaccination sites with those areas. Dr. Minter appreciates the continued support of the court for vaccinating the public.

Judge George stated approximately 12% of Fort Bend County has been vaccinated with at least their first dose and many have been given their second dose. After numerous conversations with Dr. Minter and our community partners, Judge informed the citizens of Fort Bend County, that the risk level is being lowered from red to orange (Moderate to Significant Risk). While the signs look better, it is not the time to let your guard down and everyone should follow the CDC guidelines. For any risk assessment and more information go to www.coronavirusfortbend.gov. Judge George stated the court is evaluating and considering going back to in person meetings for Commissioners Court meetings.

There were three public comments.

Bonnie Anderson signed up to speak. There was no answer when called to speak.

Seda Hambarchian, 8027 Ivy Bush Bend Lane, Richmond spoke on Item 25A. Ms. Hambarchian believes that wearing masks, social distancing and lock downs have not helped to slow the spread of coronavirus; but has suppressed people's immune system and suppressed people psychologically. Ms. Hambarchian urges the court to reconsider putting an unnecessary medical device on people who have put their trust in the County to do the right thing.

Madlena Preston spoke on Item 18C and D regarding the EpiCenter and does not want the EpiCenter (pandemic center) built in Fort Bend County.

Commissioner Prestage stated the Commissioners Court authorized a study by Conventions Sports and Leisure, CSL, to determine the feasibility of a multipurpose facility near the Fairgrounds complex. CSL had previously performed similar feasibility studies for Constellation Field and Smart Financial Center in the City of Sugar Land and had extensive knowledge of the Fort Bend County market. The result of the study was delivered to the County Judge in 2018 and was revised in 2019 to consider an expanded scope. The study result showed great demand for the facility and it could be a great benefit to the County as an economic engine, as well as, an emergency command center, make a shelter and a warming center. The Commissioners Court appointed Commissioner Vincent Morales and Commissioner Grady Prestage to serve as the committee, along with other County staff to bring back a recommendation to the County Judge for a presentation to the court for the development of the multipurpose facility. The County entered into a predevelopment agreement with Stonehenge to finalize the scope of the project which is now dubbed as the Fort Bend EpiCenter. The recommendation calls for privatize public development, where about the County will lease property to the development entity and will construct the project and lease the building to the County. The County will retain ownership of the land and will own the building when the debt on the development is paid. Total development cost, including land, are approximately \$120,000,000 and the project is scheduled for completion in the 4th quarter of 2022. A management company will be engaged to market and operate the facility with the County's oversight. The 53 acre land purchase provides an opportunity for future expansion of the facility, as well as, development of retail, restaurants, and hotels.

Commissioner Meyers indicated for clarification purposes, there seems to be some confusion for people who are under the impression that this is an epidemic facility, which it is not. This is a project that has been underway for about three years.

Commissioner Morales stated a study was performed and was publicly put out as a multipurpose building, after the study came back from CSL. The name was changed to EpiCenter because where it will be located is in the center of the County. Commissioner apologized to the community for any confusion; but this will be a project that many generations will enjoy for the future. This project will be completed in the 4th quarter of 2022. This will be a big benefit for Fort Bend County and its residents.
