The criminal intelligence analyst will create a database of information learned from reviewing jail calls and search warrant returns, and maintain communication with contiguous counties in order to quickly and effectively locate victims, offenders, and evidence. Salary and fringe benefits: 74,705.00 per year for the two year grant cycle.
