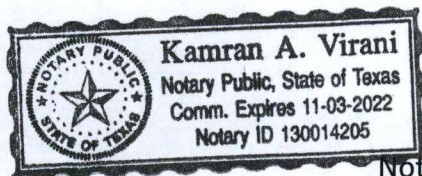

our students, now there are two ways of handling this one. We should have a referendum on this subject here."

Judy Dae: Dae has a Master's Degree in Computer Science from the New Jersey Institute of Technology, and is an IBM certified Data Scientist. She worked as a Database analyst/Database administrator. With her data analytic skills, logical approach to problem solving, multicultural experience, dedication to serving the community and passion for education, Judy Dae feels she is the right candidate for the position. She says she has the best interests of the students, parents and teachers at heart and, if elected, will serve the school district and the community she loves with tireless effort.

"I wish ours will be a community that we all work together. At meetings I attend most of the time, it's very few public audience but from time to time we have a group of people who show up. Some are very angry and some happy. To become a stronger district, we need to all work together for all the students. Another thing is we need to give the students a very positive, different pathways. We're very diverse district and we should use that as our advantage to provide strong citizenship for our future."

"I am against the single member district," Dae says. "In my opinion for an ISD needs to be united. We need to be together as a community. We need to do everything for the best of all the students. If particular areas feel they didn't get enough attention, I think that's really the fault of the board or the fault of the admin as a whole, not the fault of one single person."

Position 6 candidates:
Edrina Moss

"I am Dr. Edrina Moss, trained PhD, nurse and educator. My principles in work experiences are founded on advocacy for individual students and agitators in the community being the voice for those who are less fortunate underserved, underrepresented and are unable to advocate for themselves."

"I would like to see for the district to provide more of a physical, psychological and emotional well-being for all of the students after the trauma of learning in a global pandemic. I like to see that every student is ensured access to equitable education and the opportunity to learn, thrive and excel."

"I like to see more excellence and innovation whereby we expand upon the opportunities to follow evidence-based practices in education and curriculum design to provide students with access to 21st century state of the art resources and technology."

"We really need to know more about the desired end goal of what single member districts will yield for our community in terms of representation. Until getting a better understanding and learning more about the desired end goal of single member districts I cannot say I am for it. I need to learn more to make an informed decision."

Kristen Davison Malone: After volunteering as an elementary reading mentor, getting involved with several community groups and working directly with various school leaders, Kristen Davison Malone believes she can influence positive changes for FBISD by serving as a school board trustee. As a trustee, she will be guided by her belief that individuals want the opportunity to be a part of a community and contribute in a meaningful way. And, a solid education provides the means to do so.

Kristen's experience in business and volunteerism

have prepared her to succeed in serving as a trustee. She is the VP of Finance at CME Printing, Inc. Kristen holds a Bachelor of Business Administration in Finance from Texas A&M University.

Her priorities are: Expanding teacher and administrator mentor programs, along with revisiting more creative compensation plans, will position FBISD to recruit and retain the most talented educators, she believes.

"Establishing a LONG-TERM ZONING AND GROWTH STRATEGY provides stability to families and neighborhoods and initiates volunteerism. Campus-based reading rooms, hobby studios and recreation centers, especially those engaging our neighborhood seniors or corporate volunteers, can provide meaningful academic and social support. It's time to help make these initiatives happen."

"When it comes to our kids we shouldn't be playing politics and this election is non-partisan and if we do move to single member districts we will do what HISD has done and we will create division and there is enough of that in the world today right now. I'm opposed to single member districts pretty much."

Rafat Ulain Gilani: "As a parent, educator and 30-year resident of Fort Bend County, I am a passionate advocate for education, and I hope to bring that passion and dedication to the Fort Bend ISD Board of Trustees. My personal and professional background has prepared me to make well-informed decisions that take into consideration the immediate and future impact on all members of our community — students, families, teachers, and residents of Fort Bend County."

"As a former substitute teacher, special education teacher, and educational diagnostician; to my current role as a licensed specialist in school psychology with experience in both public and private practice, I have significant experience navigating the intricacies of the school system from all vantage points."

"My goals are to think out of the box, fiscal responsibility, solution of unique problems by collaboration and provide equity for children from all backgrounds and abilities to reach their highest potential."

On Single Member Districts, Gilani feels that there should be more research and look at all the angles in the background of highly diverse and multicultural community.

Stephanie Brown: After decades of time and dedication given to students in the Thurgood Marshall High School feeder pattern, Stephanie Brown is now hoping to focus her passion on all Fort Bend ISD students as she seeks election to the FBISD Board of Trustees Position 6. Stephanie has an extensive background in advocacy and volunteerism.

Her most recent achievement is founding and leading the Marshall Advocacy Focus Group (MAFG), a committed group of parents, students and community members collaborating with District administration to bring tangible improvements to the Marshall feeder pattern, whose concerns have been unaddressed for a long time.

Stephanie is eager to put her servant's heart and her commitment to equity in education to work as a representative of all FBISD stakeholders on the FBISD School Board.

"A lot of people know me from coming to board meetings, advocating, not afraid to speak up for the underdog. I'm not afraid to speak up for anyone. I've taken a little bit of my experience and my goals that I've implemented and executed

in one small community and I'm ready to go and execute that in all of Fort Bend ISD. A sample of some of my advocacy has already been implemented. The block scheduling started off with my focus group. My top priority is to ensure that FBISD hires the most competent and qualified superintendent for our district. I'm qualified. I'm committed. I'm confident. I'm competent and I'm your candidate of choice."

"As a long time member in the community that I live in, it is one of those things that think to be for single member districts, not so much as a board member. Some of the communities do not feel valued and so having a person that they can go to and share their concerns in our district is why single member district is important to certain parts of the community. But, I would like to listen to what both entities may bring to the district because not knowing everything I'm not going to say that Single Member District would be great. Also, we have to do better job of listening to people."

Allison Drew:

As a thought leader, she is able to combine her IT prowess with her nursing skills to bring unique, innovative solutions to the world of Electronic Healthcare data.

"I'm the one just right. I meet appropriate balance of having just enough board experience to hit the ground running and carry us forward without weighing down our future with methods from the past; to train and well-versed in how we oversee through policy. I'm committed to getting our students back as fast and community back to normal mitigating change."

"I'm committed to preventing staff attrition as we were a new student. I'm still new enough in my board commitment to have the bandwidth and stick with the superintendent and as a transition and grow and before we think of that, we'll provide stability for those of us that are parents we know that's what we need to do."

As a member of the Policy and Calendar Committees, she advocates for District-wide planning using a consistent set of principles applicable to all schools/attendance zones.

As a member of the Teacher of the Year Committee, she supports teachers by recognizing their achievements and providing opportunities for professional growth. Instrumental in approval of funds to improve the quality of our Fine Arts and Athletics facilities.

She is a Proponent of new programs of choice including the recently opened CTE Center, P-TECH and Early College High School programs, Early Literacy Centers, Full Day Pre-K, Piano Technician

Program, and many more.

Drew advocates for equal access to all programs and courses at every FBISD campus. Works to ensure all schools are staffed and equipped to keep our children safe and secure.

"Single Member District warrants much more discussion. Personally as a parent, I don't want decisions to be made by a majority that I cannot hold accountable with my vote. However as a trustee, I know that this decision has to be something that's made in partnership with the community. We've not educated the community on even what we mean by single member districts. I've heard several versions of it and we really should be looking into options that balance the enforcement."

Addie Heyliger:

Addie Heyliger was elected in May 2015 and re-elected in 2018, and currently serves as Board President. She is the manager of the Portfolio, Release and Integration Office at CenterPoint Energy and is an adjunct professor at Houston Community College. She is also a certified Project Management Professional.

"The last six years I have been working hard. I have proven leadership. During my tenure on the board, the Fort Bend Independent School District increased the academic ratings for schools that required academic improvement. Additional accomplishments include creation of an Early Literacy Center, offering Early College High School and Pathways in Technology programs, development of universal course selection for all high school students, establishment of special education improvement programs for more inclusion of special needs children, institution of a board leadership academy, and most importantly, driving high academic accountability for all the students in the district."

"My priority will be to get a new superintendent to enable him or her to lead this district. I bring experience and I make sure that all our kids get back to school face to face safely."

"This district was built 60 years ago with one line going down the district, we have a East and West. It's important to me now 60 years later that we have a different voting system. I support single member districts. I support the fact that our district has grown in diversity, it has grown in population and we should be able to have people come from the different geographical lines in our district. We haven't had an opportunity to see what they even look like. Is it a seven member district? Is it four or is it three at large? We need the opportunity to have the conversation, it's time."
