## 4. Public Comments regarding the Agenda and Announcements.

Judge George announced this week is Fire Safety week, October 3 -9, 2021. A moment of silence was observed to honor fallen firefighters and their families.

Dr. Jacquelyn Minter, Health & Human Services Director gave an update on the status of COVID in Fort Bend County. An average of 243 new cases per day were reported during the reporting week last week. Hospitalizations, due to COVID, had an average of 125 patients per day last week. Admissions to ICU, for patients with COVID, were at 19% last week, which is a decrease of 1 in 5 patients. An additional 24 COVID related deaths have been confirmed last week, which brings the total deaths in Fort Bend County close to 900, over the course of the pandemic. The cases are still occurring more in unvaccinated residents. Testing numbers have greatly decreased and the no-cost testing continues in each Precinct of the County. Vaccinations also continue in each Precinct and have seen first dose vaccinations increase in many of our community outreaches, as well as booster doses. Fort Bend County now has almost 3 in 4 residents with at least one dose of the vaccine.

Tami Frazier, Communications Director for the Office of the County Judge presented a Proclamation to 4-H members of the Youth Development Program of the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Services and designated the week of October 3 – 9, 2021 as National 4-H week in Fort Bend County, TX.

Ms. Frazier also presented a proclamation in recognition to Angels Surviving Cancer, a breast cancer survivorship organization whose mission is to enlighten, empower, encourage and educate the community about breast health awareness.
