4. Public Comments regarding the Agenda and Announcements.

No public comments.

Dr. Jacquelyn Minter, Director of Health & Human Services stated based on Fort Bend County data the total number of vaccination doses administered to all eligible Fort Bend County residents from any provider now stands at over 990,000. This includes 6,000 Fort Bend County children ages 5 – 11 who have been vaccinated at locations throughout the Greater Houston area since the authorization in early November. The declining cases has slowed with having 70 new cases daily. The decrease in hospitalizations, including ICU bed usage, due to COVID, has tapered off. The County’s current number of confirmed deaths related to complications of COVID stands at 1,006. Vaccinations, face coverings in crowded spaces, avoiding group settings and testing for early diagnosis can help protect against the spread of SARS-CoV-2. HHS is encouraging everyone, during this holiday season, to remember some people are more vulnerable to the severe effects of COVID and should take actions to protect those who are high risk.

Judge George asked everyone to remember in our prayers those lost due to COVID. He announced last week the County lowered the threat level to yellow. Judge said this does not mean we are out of COVID and asked everyone to follow the CDC guidelines. For those traveling, go to www.fbchealth.org for travel guidance or any update regarding COVID. Judge wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving and reminded everyone that the County offices will be closed Thursday and Friday, November 25 and November 26.

Tami Frazier, Communications Director for the Office of the County Judge presented a Proclamation, on behalf of Commissioners Court, to Child Advocates of Fort Bend County in recognition of National Adoption Day on November 19, 2021.

Commissioner Meyers wished everyone a very Happy Thanksgiving.

Commissioner Morales wished all the employees and constituents a wonderful Thanksgiving.

Judge George stated, last year, 2,300 children received services from Child Advocates of Fort Bend County, which is greatly appreciated.
