

Michelle Wallace (Gatlins BBQ), Paris Anton (Vegan AF-ish) and Victoria Elizondo (Cochinita & Co.), Slow Dough Bread Co, will be on site with hand-made pretzels.

General Admission tickets are \$90 for adults and \$20 for children and this includes ets, farm tours and live music. There are also VIP tickets at \$135/adult and \$20/child and they include admission to the event one-hour early, entry into bites, six drink tickets, farm tours and five music.

This year the culinary event added several more experi-ences. These are add-on experiences that may be purchased. but guests must have a ticket to Chef Fest in order to partici-pate. For kids who like to cook, the kids cooking class may be purchased for \$25/participant. Chefs Jane Wild and Lindsey Fequen will lead this class teaching young chefs how to peel and chop farm veggies for build-your-own "tacos," and make natural egg dyes and deviled eggs. Chef Alvin Schultz's pickling and fermentation class will cost \$15, and the soft-serve station will cost \$10.
