# RESOLUTION APPROVING PLAN OF FINANCE FOR THE HARRIS COUNTY CULTURAL EDUCATION FACILITIES FINANCE CORPORATION TO FINANCE AND REFINANCE A PROJECT FOR MEMORIAL HERMANN HEALTH SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the Harris County Cultural Education Facilities Finance Corporation, pursuant to section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "Code"), after reasonable public notice (hereinafter referred to as the "Notice"), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, has conducted a public hearing on a plan of finance including the proposed issuance of its limited obligation revenue bonds in one or more series and in one or more years in an aggregate approximate maximum principal amount of \$975,000,000 (hereinafter referred to as the "Bonds"), to finance or refinance projects described in the Notice (herein referred to as the "Projects"), including a project located in Fort Bend County, Texas (the "County"), for all of which Memorial Hermann Health System, a Texas non-profit corporation, or an affiliate is the legal owner or principal user; and

WHEREAS, approval by this Court or the County Judge of the County of the plan of finance for the Project that is located in the County and to be financed or refinanced by the Bonds is a condition to the exclusion of interest on the Bonds from the gross income of the owners thereof for federal income tax purposes and, consequently, is necessary to finance or refinance such Project at the favorable interest rates which are borne by tax-exempt obligations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF FORT BEND COUNTY, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. The plan of finance for the Project located in the County, including issuance of the Bonds in one or more series and in one or more years in an aggregate approximate maximum principal amount of \$975,000,000, with an approximate maximum aggregate principal amount for such Project specified in the Notice, is hereby approved pursuant to section 147(f) of the Code.

SECTION 2. The approval herein granted is solely for purposes of section 147(f) of the Code and shall not be construed as a representation, warranty, or other undertaking of any kind by the County in respect of the Bonds or the Projects. The Bonds shall not constitute obligations of the State of Texas, the County, or any other political subdivision or agency thereof, or a pledge of the faith and credit of any of them. Neither the State of Texas nor any political subdivision or agency thereof, including the County, shall be obligated to pay the Bonds or the interest thereon. Neither the faith and credit nor the taxing power of the State of Texas, the County, or any other political subdivision or agency thereof shall be pledged to the payment of principal of, redemption premium, if any, or interest on the Bonds.

SECTION 3. The County Judge, the County Commissioners, and the County Clerk and other officers of the County, or any of them, are hereby authorized to execute and deliver such endorsements, certificates, instruments, documents, or other papers and to do all other things necessary or advisable to give effect to the intent and purpose hereof.

### NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

TAKE NOTICE THAT, for purposes of Section 147 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, the Harris County Cultural Education Facilities Finance Corporation (the "Issuer") will hold a public hearing on April 4, 2022, at 10:00 a.m., accessible to the public by telephone, with respect to a plan of financing that will consist of the issuance, in one or more series and in one or more years, of the Issuer's limited obligation revenue bonds (the "Bonds").
