# 2023 Stub Budget: August-September

- We experienced a net increase vs budget by \$101,163.69. The upside was due to:
  - Increased revenue generated from volleyball and basketball practices that were not in the Stub Budget in the amount of \$10,375.08
  - Lower COGS which created a larger GP of \$178,327.79 over the budget of \$135,740.00
  - Management of the expenses resulted in a savings of \$58,579.92 due to decrease in utilities and other expenses.

## 2024 Operational Budget: October-December

- The design and versatility of the arena has enabled us to book a variety of events such as:
  - Top Rank ESPN Championship Boxing, All Elite Wrestling Dynamite/Rampage, Texas Gun Show, International Diwali Dusshera Festival, Carden International Circus, Hot Wheels Live Monster Truck Show and Varsity Spirit Cheer competitions
  - · Two national broadcasts in October showcasing the Fort Bend County Epicenter on ESPN (Top Rank) and TBS (AEW)
  - Houston Volleyball Academy and Fort Bend Christian Homeschool Athletics train at the arena 5 days a week in the multipurpose area
  - We are trending at about 60% of budget in bookings and continue to book events.
- · Sponsorship demand is strong with major sponsorship signings across various categories:
  - Energy Texas, Southwest Mitsubishi, Bud Light, Pepsi, GFL Environmental, Chick Fil A, and Williams Smokehouse
  - Ongoing discussions with sponsors across grocery, healthcare/hospital, banking categories
  - Sponsorships are budgeted at \$550K and we have already secured \$428K for 2024. This revenue will be amortized over a 12-month period.
- Looking ahead at the first quarter, we will begin to get a better feel for the profitability of each event and Food and Beverage.
- We will continue to monitor costs and implement cost saving measures. We will have a better
  understanding of the utilities required to maintain and operate the building.
