Proclamation




- WHEREAS,** domestic violence remains a pervasive issue that affects individuals and families across all communities, and Fort Bend County stands united in supporting those impacted by this crisis; and
- WHEREAS,** since 1980, the Fort Bend Women's Center has been the sole provider of emergency shelter and a 24-hour crisis hotline for survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault in Fort Bend County, serving more than 3,322 survivors, including 831 children, in the past year alone; and
- WHEREAS,** the Center's mission is grounded in the pillars of **Survive, Revive, and Thrive**—empowering survivors to survive crisis through safety and shelter, revive hope through counseling and advocacy, and thrive through education, independence, and long-term empowerment; and
- WHEREAS,** for 45 years, the Fort Bend Women's Center has remained a steadfast source of healing, advocacy, and protection for those fleeing violence, and continues to lead with compassion, expertise, and vision;

and extends its deep appreciation to the Fort Bend Women's Center for its enduring leadership, dedication, and unwavering commitment to breaking the cycle of abuse.


