Ms. Turner feels like there is a case for the AG, but it is not confirmed. Ms. Turner is comfortable that the Texas Association of Counties, whose job it is to provide such guidance, is telling us we are on solid ground. The court would like to return to a certain item and take that matter up now. If there is anyone with a concern about this course of action, say it now.

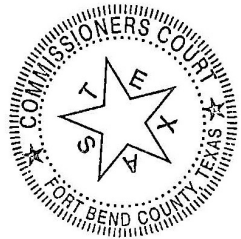
