County Clerk's Note:

Mr. Babst thanked the County Attorney's Office, County Judge's Office and County Clerk's Office for getting out the Declaration of Local Disaster. Once the Declaration was out, OEM was able to move and stage resources in a timely manner in case of the freeze. Demobilization started yesterday, and the County will be back to Level 4, the normal operating standard, at 12:00 p.m. today.

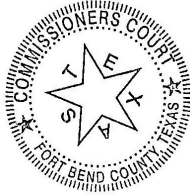
Bridgette Smith-Lawson, County Attorney, stated the Court could allow the Order to terminate. The Order will expire by law, if not extended within seven days. The Court can choose to take no action.

Judge George stated on the record that after spending time at the EOC for four days, Fort Bend County has some exceptional people who were working. They include many departments, with Greg Babst and his EOC team leading, Road and Bridge, all the law enforcement agencies (Sheriff's Department, all Constables 1, 2, 3 and 4), HHS, County Attorney's Office, County Clerk's Office, Library staff and many other County employees took time to participate in this freeze event. Thanks to Fort Bend County residents for listening to calls and emails. There are many people who made sacrifices in order for the citizens to be safe.
